

Just Right

I've always been fascinated by science. I love learning about new things and science was the one subject that seemed to have an endless supply of knowledge just waiting to be explored. In high school I took Anatomy as a senior just for fun. Then when I was in college, and needed science credits for my teaching degree, I chose things like Meteorology and Astronomy. I could have chosen to repeat a subject I was more familiar with for an easy A, but I wasn't interested in that at all. Learning new things



was exciting, and if I was going to be paying for it anyway, then you better believe I was going to enjoy myself. Some people might say that you can't really be pro-science and pro-God, but personally, all those classes did was make me believe in God even more. The fact that earth even exists, much less supports life, is a complete miracle. Just like the story of Goldilocks, we're here because everything we need to stay alive is "just right". Our distance from the sun, size of our planet, minerals in the soil, chemicals in the atmosphere, etc. All of it is "just right". One little tip of the scales either way and we'd be toast. So it's very hard for me to believe that it's all one big cosmic coincidence. Now, are there things about science that contradict the Bible? Absolutely, but the one constant truth about science, is that what might be true today won't necessarily be true tomorrow because just like our world changes every day, science continues to evolve the longer we study it.

When I look at this world around me and really take the time to study its intricacies; I'm in awe. The care and attention that went into creation can be difficult to truly comprehend, and the scriptures really only give you the "bullet points". The rest of the details are left to us. For example in Genesis 1:11,

Then God said, "Let the land produce vegetation: seed-bearing plants and trees on the land that bear fruit with seed in it, according to their various kinds. And it was so." Get Out of the Boat

One thing I struggle with the most in my life is worry. I worry about small things (such as weekend plans), big things (career moves), and everything in between. Unfortunately, this struggle also extends into my relationship with Jesus Christ. I think I know the plan that is set before

of the boat and starts towards Jesus. As he's walking, he feels the wind. Suddenly he's not sure of himself. We know what happens next: Peter starts to sink and cries out to be saved. The Bible says Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught Peter. "You of little faith", he said, "why did you doubt?"



me and that I have the tenacity to stay the course- but at the slightest hint of opposition or deterrence, I second-guess my ability to trust Jesus with my life. And if I can't trust Jesus with my life, then have I really given it to Him?

We all know the story of the disciples alone in the boat while Jesus went off by Himself to pray, and Jesus calls Peter out of the boat to walk towards Him. Peter hesitates, ultimately starts walking towards Jesus on the water, feels the wind and gets spooked, then starts to sink. It's a short and catchy story that's easy to articulate and illustrate with both kids and adults alike. As a child and teen hearing this story, it was easy for me to chastise Peter for hesitating to get out of the boat: *Come on, man! It's Jesus! Why would you not jump out of the boat and run full force towards Him?* But re-reading this story as a highly anxious, overtly distressed adult, I empathize with Peter's hesitation.

After coming to the conclusion that Jesus wasn't a phantom on the water, Peter then tells Jesus: "Lord, if it's you...tell me to come to you on the water." Peter isn't giving Jesus instructions – he's asking for Jesus to give him a chance to trust Him. *Lord, if that's you, give me the opportunity to believe. Lord, give me a reason to step out onto the rocky waters in the midst of your safety.* So Jesus tells him to come. Peter gets out

Peter asked for a chance to prove his faith and it led to a demonstration of doubt. He was so sure at first- walking steadily towards Jesus. But at the first hint of opposition or deterrence, he began to sink. Think of a time when it was really easy for you to trust God with your life. Then let me guess...as soon as things started going wrong or got difficult, you high-tailed it back to safety, which consisted of YOUR structure and plan for your life. You turned your back on the open waters and headed back toward the boat.

I'd like to think that we all have good intentions, just like Peter did. Peter got out of the boat because he wanted to believe it was possible with Jesus. We say we trust God and believe His power to be mightier than any enemies that rise against us. But then Peter allowed his fear of the wind to overpower his faith in Jesus, and we allow inconveniences and discomfort to cause us to seek the safety of the boat. If Peter said, "I trust you Jesus, but I'm more comfortable standing in the boat. How about you just come to me?" I'm sure you would read that and say it was ridiculous! Peter couldn't have fully trusted Jesus and yet refuse to step out on faith towards Him. But isn't that what we do? God, I trust you, but I'm just way more comfortable sitting in this boat. If there's something you have planned for my life, can you just bring it to me?

Maybe you're struggling with something in your life that you just can't trust God completely with. Maybe you see Jesus standing on the water, inviting you to trust him and to step out on faith. Maybe the water is too deep and the risk is too great. Maybe you DID step out on faith, but the moment you did there was some resistance (wind) and your faith started to wane. Maybe you're longing for the safety and security that only YOUR plan for your life can bring. You want to trust Jesus – but you're worried about the waves. You want to have a relationship with Jesus- but you're worried about the wind. You really don't want to doubt God- but you're worried about how deep the water is. You're worried about everything but Jesus. He's not asking you to worry – He's asking you to trust. Get out of the boat and walk.

Life Saver: Jesus

Growing up in Daytona, we would go to the beach quite often. I remember going just about every day in the summer with my mom, brother and a few other kids. We would go early in the morning before it got too hot and too crowded. We would play in the soft white sands near the dunes and closest to the seawall. We would also play in the harder, wet mud and build sand castles or try to dig a hole to the other side of the world (but it kept filling up with water!!!). We would play in the water by splashing in the waves, riding our boogie boards or “bodysurfing” up to the shore. Those were some great memories. I’m sure if you’ve been to the beach, you could share a few memories, too.

Not too often, though, there was a different kind of activity occurring on the beach which wasn’t so fun. It never involved anyone in my family or anyone with me, but on occasion, we would witness a rescue by the lifeguards on the beach. I seem to remember there being a long and loud whistle blown while the lifeguard pointed sternly with a flag at someone who had gone too far out into the water and needed to either come in immediately or the lifeguards would advance into the surf and rescue them. Most times, the guilty party would make their way in to shore safely on their own, but sometimes the lifeguard would have to quickly move out into the water and rescue the person before they drown in the rough surf waters of the Atlantic Ocean.

At this year’s VBS, Makin’ Waves, one of the nights will have the focus of Jesus as our Life Saver. This is something Jesus never shied away from as He even proclaimed His reason for coming was to seek and save the lost. More specifically though, and especially in relation to the theme for this day of VBS, Jesus mentioned He not only came here to rescue, but to give life and so much more.

John 7:38 says, “Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them.”

Here we see Jesus is proclaiming that not only will we be brought to life, but we will have living water flowing within us!! Jesus comes not only to save our lives but to make them better! With Jesus it’s more than just survival, it is a life that is abundantly blessed and overwhelmingly loved.



Not unlike the person who needs rescue from the rough waves of the surf, Jesus wants to come into our life and rescue us from the things of this world that are overwhelming us and drowning us. Like Peter when he was walking on water and took his eyes off Jesus, Jesus wants to reach out His hand and pull us out of our desperate circumstances. Praise God for the rescue we have in Christ. The apostle Paul echoes this when he tells us in Colossians that God, through Jesus, has “rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom” (Col 1:13).

But with Jesus, there is more! While a lifeguard can rescue you from the water, they can’t teach you to swim on the spot and make you a better person just because they rescued you. With Jesus, we are both rescued AND empowered!! He not only is our Life SAVER, but He also is our Life MAKER. He saves our lives from the disaster and despair of our sin and makes our lives something even more than we could have ever imagined. Praise be to God for his indescribable gift!

So, next time you go to the beach, look at the lifeguards sitting in their tall, red chairs, peering over the horizon watching intently for anyone in need of rescue. May it remind you of the rescue we have in Christ and the life He has in store for us. It all begins when you let Jesus be your LIFE SAVER!

Ripple Effect

(FRUITS OF THE SPIRIT)

This morning I started Louie Giglio's new book *Don't Give the Enemy a Seat at Your Table*. I made it about two chapters in before I started to weep. He wrote this book in the wake of COVID-19's outbreak to address how Satan has crept his way into our minds and planted seeds that we have allowed to grow, unchecked and out of control. His study of Psalm 23 reminds us that we are meant to sit in the presence of God. Our enemy does not belong there. But too often we pull a chair up and tell him to sit down and make himself comfortable.

By letting Satan camp out and sow seeds of hate, jealousy, disorder, evil, and chaos into our lives; we trade the fruit of God's Holy Spirit for a fruit that poisons our hearts and ultimately results in disconnection and separation from God. But the fruit of the Spirit is life-giving, sustaining, and heart-changing. We get to choose what we feast on, and who we feast with.

Fruit begins with a seed, which turns into a young and vulnerable plant, which then – over time and with proper care – turns into a strong tree that produces fruit to feed others, season after season. We know the fruit of the Holy Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, and self-control. To sustain the fruit of the spirit in our lives, we need to recognize its seeds, nurture them and help them grow, then we will be able to produce a life lived as an example of who Jesus is, and when we show that life to others we will be able to plant those seeds of the spirit in others. We get to choose what we feast on, and who we feast with.

What's around you will either nurture you or steal from you. Who you allow to sit at your table – to spend time with you, to invest in you, to influence you – will either allow your fruit of the spirit to grow, it may hinder its growth or kill it off entirely. Like a weed, Satan likes to creep into our minds and choke out the thoughts that God has placed in your mind and pervert

them into thoughts that do not reflect the person or heart of God. Who we allow to sit at our table is important, we should make sure we are seeking out the presence of God first and foremost.

The reason this book affected me so much is I had not realized how Satan had created a ripple effect in my life. Seeds of distrust, misunderstanding, and anger had been festering in my heart; which in turn had begun to leak out of what I thought



were isolated feelings into other areas of my life. What I needed to do was recognize that those thoughts were not from God but straight from the enemy. I needed to sit with God in his presence and seek out his will about those things, and allow the Spirit to change my heart so my hands, feet, and mouth would produce the fruit of the Spirit.

I realized at the end of all this drama in my own heart that I needed to repent of something, and to forgive the person I was directing my thoughts at. Maybe, in order to begin a ripple effect caused by the Spirit, you need to do the same. Let your thoughts be directed by God, and learn to recognize when Satan is hindering God's work in you by planting diseased seeds of thought in your mind and heart. We receive the fruit of the Spirit when we are sitting at God's table in his presence, and we create a ripple effect of the Spirit when we let our actions and words reflect that we are keeping His company.

MISSION SPOTLIGHT



**His Eyes Honduras
Felipe & Valerie Colby**

A few months ago, Kathleen Peters, former ECC member, contacted me about the importance of meeting a missionary couple she knew. If you know Kathleen, you don't say no to her, so I politely accepted and set up a time to meet this couple the next day.

That next morning, I spent a good 90 minutes in conversation with Felipe & Valerie Colby, an amazing couple who are passionate Kingdomworkers serving in Honduras. Here is a little bit more about what they do through their ministry, His Eyes Honduras:

(From the His Eyes website www.hiseyeshonduras.com):

His Eyes was created to serve Gods work in and around Tegucigalpa, Honduras. Specifically, the mission reaches out to the people in Tegucigalpa through the work of the Body of Christ Christian Clinic (Clinica Cristiana Cuerpo de Cristo.)

In 2009 the clinic reopened into a brand new building with almost four times the space, and has grown again since then. We were then able to assist the community in ways we never could have before. From here in Tegucigalpa, God grew the work from a clinic to far beyond that.

The name His Eyes though came from seeing that we were being called to bring spiritual and physical healing, which

although started in medical work, has expanded to Church plants, clothing outreach, scholarships, children's outreach, short term mission groups, and farming ministries. All of which have a physical component of bringing healing, but all have the common goal of reaching more people for Christ, here in Honduras and especially through our short-term mission program, around the world. We are called to not see the world as we see it, but to use His Eyes to see what He (Christ) would have us see.

We do not support them directly through our regular Faith Promise support, but recently were able to partner with them in a unique opportunity. Through our Faith Promise "special projects" fund, we were able to fully fund a "mini-clinic" to be built on the site of one of the local churches they have planted. This clinic will offer optometry, dental and general health services to all those who live in the surrounding area. Because of the location of the clinic being at the church, there is an immediate connection with the community and the church and an immense opportunity to overwhelm the community with the love of Christ by meeting their needs not only physically, but spiritually and emotionally, as well.



Note: Their mission works with the communities to provide economic improvement through farming and agriculture. They have fruit tree orchards and coffee bean farms that directly impact the community and the ministry. While they visited, Felipe shared some of their coffee, Hill Climber Coffee, with me. If you've been to our Wednesday PM Bible Study, then you've been drinking their coffee!

Special Wednesday Programming in June


June 1 – Regular midweek programming for all ages

June 8 – **ECC Annual Congregational Meeting** – No adult programming. Normal programming for ages birth through high school


June 15 – **VBS** – No regular programming or fellowship meal. See VBS post for details about that event

June 29 – **Patriotic Service** – Special adult program in the WC. All other regular programming will occur but all children and youth are welcome to participate in the Patriotic Service.






