📍 ABOUT BEULAH

The name Beulah means “Married” or “Joined Together.” In Isaiah 62, God promises that His people will no longer be identified by shame or abandonment. Instead, they will be called Hephzibah (“My Delight Is in Her”) and Beulah, because the Lord delights in His people and restores them into covenant relationship with Himself.

Beulah is not simply a destination on the map. It is a picture of restoration, belonging, and the faithfulness of God to fulfill every promise He has made.

THREE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT BEULAH



1. BEULAH IS A PROMISE, NOT A CITY

Unlike Nazareth or Jerusalem, Beulah is not a physical location. It is a prophetic name given to God's restored people, symbolizing His covenant love and future hope.



2. BEULAH REPRESENTS RESTORATION

Isaiah declares that God's people will no longer be known as Forsaken or Desolate. Their identity changes because God has acted on their behalf.



3. BEULAH POINTS TO HOME

Throughout Scripture, God's desire has always been to dwell with His people. Beulah reminds us that every step of the journey has been leading toward deeper relationship with Him.

ISAIAH 62:1–5

“For Zion’s sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem’s sake I will not rest, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a lamp that burns.”

The imagery in Isaiah 62 celebrates covenant, joy, and restoration using the language of a wedding.



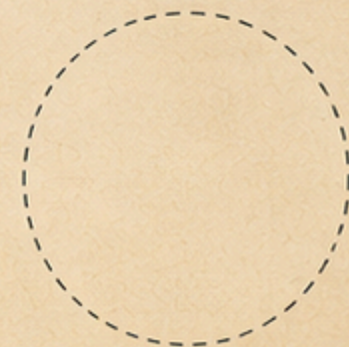
Throughout history, “Beulah” has become a symbol of hope in Christian hymns, literature, and preaching.
