A small Gentile town near Sidon on the Phoenician coast. This is where Elijah found a widow with almost nothing—and a God who specializes in meeting our needs.

THREE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT ZAREPHATH



1. IT WAS A COASTAL PHOENICIAN TOWN

Zarephath was located about 20 miles north of Israel along the Mediterranean coast in the region of Sidon.



2. IT WAS A PLACE OF TRADE AND CULTURE

Situated on ancient trade routes, Zarephath was influenced by Phoenician culture and known for its seafaring and commerce.



3. IT WAS A PLACE OF SCARCITY

During the drought, Zarephath was experiencing famine—yet it became the location of one of God's greatest provisions.
