He Vs Risen

From our Senior Pastor

The time of Easter is upon us and I couldn't be more excited, but first Holy Week. I want to thank all of you for your attendance in church and experiencing with me each week the "Service of Diminishing Lights." Lent does carry with it the inherent irony that while the days grow longer, the time with Jesus grows shorter. The disciples went with Jesus to Jerusalem with great expectations for what Jesus would do only to run, hide, deny, and even betray him on Good Friday, but they too did not know and could not see, what God had in store. Jesus did die. Jesus experienced fully that final separation and cutting off from God in a unique way as he descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead.

Easter is the day of great light. Jesus walks out of a tomb, a grave, a place where death seemed to have the final say, but it has no say any longer. Whatever we think is true of the church the fact of Jesus' bodily resurrection and coming return, are the indisputable facts and hope of the church. We do well to keep this in mind, when we go about our lives and our lives of ministry. Whatever we find ourselves doing and wherever we find ourselves doing it, ministry must reflect and proclaim these two things. But to get there, we travel to the cross, and we do so with our brothers and sisters on Maundy Thursday and with each other on Good Friday. We do not run away. We walk with heads held high, and spirits a little low, knowing that we too have much to confess as we make our way to the cross. Yet confession leads to glory, and the proclamation of the incredible news that when we go with the women to the grave, we will also hear, "He is not here, he is Risen!" He is Risen Indeed!

Dwelling in the Word: A Personal and Communal Practice


The Bethany staff gathers in the Library every Tuesday morning at 10:00am, and we begin with the practice of Dwelling in the Word. When the church session and the deacon board meet every month, they also begin their meeting by first looking at a passage of scripture together.

Dwelling in the Word is something that was new to me when I started at Bethany, and I am grateful that Pastor Brian introduced it to me. I have personally found that this method of studying scripture helps me to slow down, to listen to the Holy Spirit, and to listen to how the Spirit is working in our community.

I thought the members of our congregation might be interested to know more about it, so here is how it works:

- (1) A volunteer prays and then reads the passage out loud -- everyone has a copy of the passage or their own Bible in front of them;
- (2) the group pauses for silence and everyone takes the time to review the passage, pondering words or phrases that stand out to them;
- (3) the passage is read out loud again, followed by more silence;
- (4) everyone is asked to find a partner in the room, usually the person they know the least or as Pastor Brian says, "a reasonably friendly looking stranger";
- (5) once everyone has a partner, they take time to share with one another what stood out to them and why...what captured their imagination, what challenges or grasps them, or even how the Holy Spirit might be "nudging" them;
- (6) the group gathers back together, and people volunteer to share what they heard from their partner (not what they themselves think or conclude).

I have loved hearing and seeing how the Scripture speaks to us as a community, in community. The staff uses the same passage for several weeks at a time, and there are always different ideas and lessons that we glean, depending on what is happening in our lives and in the world. This practice also teaches us the importance of listening to one another. Above all, I think this practice demonstrates a central lesson that Jesus taught us: that we are to dwell...abide...remain in him, for without Him, the Living Word, we cannot bear fruit (John 15).





Divine Virtues - Prudence by Doug Bovard

Scriptures: Proverbs 12:16; 12:23; 14:8; 14:15; 16:21; 18:15; 19:14; and 22:23.

Matthew 9:4; 21:24; 25:15–21; John 6:61.

I like to think of prudence as a quiet, unseen virtue. It is often manifested in something we did not do or say. It is better demonstrated than defined. As you can imagine, Proverbs has a lot to say about prudence. Please read the scriptures above. Only the unwise will ignore this virtue. It is a keen awareness of all aspects of a matter so that our response protects us and others. Careful consideration, informed judgement, controlled emotions, assessed risk, and heeded advice are just some elements of prudence.

The footnote in my study bible for Proverbs 12:16 is noteworthy. It reads as follows:


Self-control is characteristic of the wise. The fool reacts too strongly and too soon, destroying relationships. The wise person leaves the way open for reconciliation.

Let us not be quick to anger when we see wrong. Proverbs 12:23 reminds us not to "parade" our knowledge and to curb our tongue. Proverbs 14:15 teaches us not to believe everything we hear and to be skilled in our judgment. Proverbs 18:15 teaches us to seek and acquire knowledge. Do we make decisions without information? Do we make risky assumptions? Proverbs 22:3 teaches us to have foresight about the reality of evil in our world and protect ourselves and loved ones. Let us not stumble blindly into problems.

Everything our Lord Jesus Christ did was a demonstration of perfect prudence. He knew the thoughts of the Pharisees and He knew the reasoning of their hearts. He was aware of his disciples grumbling. Of course, we will never have the perfect prudence of Jesus, but this virtue of prudence is a blessing we need to develop. How can we be more prudent as parents? More prudent in our marriage? More prudent in our disagreements and negotiations?
