

New Year...Same Jesus



We love to say, and we correctly say that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow; Hebrews 15:8 always rings true. Yes, the same Jesus. But when we encounter him, we might be the ones who change. The gospel is ever before us, and when we encounter this, we may find things that we are not used to. After all, just because Jesus never changes does not mean his story will not change us. In fact, theologically speaking, to come to Jesus is to be changed. Difficult though that is because people don't love change. Change has to occur. Without it we simply would not be able to grow up or change our perspective on things. We would never know what we value or be able to pursue truth.

Epiphany means "a manifestation of the divine." It is also defined as "a moment of clarity, sudden realization or insight."

This year, to celebrate the start of the season of Epiphany, January 6th through February 22nd, Ash Wednesday, Bethany will be introducing a meaningful new activity. Everyone will receive a "Star Word" during church on Sunday, January 15th. Just like the star that led the Wise Men to the Christ-child in Bethlehem, this word, which you will randomly be given, is to serve as a word to guide you for the year 2023. Along with your Star Word, you'll receive some instructions or suggestions on how to utilize it as a spiritual practice.

For example, you can: Consistently begin your prayer time by focusing on that word; When reading scripture, make note of the word and the context in which it appears; Consider how you can find ways to use that word in your life; Ask the Lord to teach you more about the meaning of that word. In 2019, my word was "Rest," and I discovered that God was helping me to find things that I consider to be restful: cooking, hiking, or volunteering. Thanks to that Star Word, which I put in a prominent place in my kitchen, I was constantly reminded that I needed to care for myself, rest my mind and spirit, but also rest in the Lord.

As the weeks and months go by, you will have opportunities to share with other congregation members and friends about how your Star Word continues to challenge you, speak to you, or guide you. So, get ready for your own Epiphany -- a showing of the Divine Love that will be revealed to you, wherever your journey may take you in this New Year!

Please Note: If you do not attend worship on January 15th, we will have Star Words available in the Welcome Center for the remainder of the month. We are also able to mail a Star Word to people who may be out of town or unable to come to church.

Divine Virtues - Temperance by Doug Bovard

Scriptures: Prov. 25:28; 1 Peter 4:7; Rom. 6:20, 7:15-25; Romans 12:1-2; Eph. 1:3, 17-20; Ephesians 4:1-6; Gal. 5:16-23 and Eccl. 3. When you hear the word temperance your mind may recall the Prohibition era and the "temperance" movement of a hundred years ago. It was a time when a good biblical virtue became more associated with a political movement that was disconnected from the gospel of Jesus Christ. However, a biblical definition of temperance is simply self-control and moderation. The Bible has much to say about it. "A man without self-control is like a city broken into and without walls" (Prov. 25:28). To be without self-control is to be spiritually vulnerable and defenseless. We are exhorted to cultivate self-control, that our bodies may be a living sacrifice and that our minds might be renewed (Romans 12:1-2) and Jesus himself demonstrates this even as he is on trial for his life. Jesus rejects violence as a means to solve our problems, (John 18:10-11.)

Self-control is not something we come by naturally or can produce in ourselves. Even in our union with Christ, we struggle with the remaining corruption (including lack of self-control) within us (Rom. 6:20, 7:15-25). The good news is that the power that raised Jesus Christ is the same power we receive by faith in Christ to a new life giving us godly self-control (Eph. 1:17-20). We are no longer under sin's power, penalty and curse. We have been given liberty in Christ to "walk in the Spirit" (Gal. 5:16-23). We wrestle with the flesh but are no longer under control by the flesh. As Paul reminds us that the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

Self-control is the fruit of the Spirit and is the gracious work of Christ in our hearts. We become more like Christ whose desire was to do the will of His heavenly father (John 5:30). If you are in Christ, you have been blessed with "every spiritual blessing" in Him (Eph. 1:3).

Temperance should not be confused with inaction. How do we demonstrate temperance and righteous indignation? What does Ecclesiastes chapter 3 teach us?





