Give Thanks and Be With

I have to say that when it comes to all things Thanksgiving, nothing is more wonderful and exciting than an excellently cooked turkey. No doubt, we all have memories of the smells we love while we watch parades and get ready for football games to be watched, and played. We love Turkey Day. But I also have memories of missing one person in the family. Sometimes my Mom, sometimes an Aunt, even an Uncle from time to time. They were missing because they were always checking on "The Bird". Maybe they were basting it every 30 minutes. Maybe they were making sure it wasn't getting too dark. Who knows, but the memory remains. And, so, I suppose I am most thankful these days for digital read thermometers.

I should explain. I remember the first time I got to cook a Turkey for my family at Thanksgiving. I brined it overnight – I have rethought this technique since – patted it dry stuffed the cavity with some onions and sage, and stuck a digital read thermometer into the thickest part of the breast and cooked it at 375° until it reached an internal temperature of 165°. I can remember that it was cooked. I cannot remember if it was good. What I do remember is being able to spend time with my family. No constant checking the bird, no need to wait or check a timer or try and guess how many minutes per pound. Please know that if you are a traditionalist and like to do things this way, no judgment. I just like being able to "set it and forget it." I was able to play football and cards and watch the parade without worry. I could be with my family. These days my thermometer is Bluetooth capable and connects to my phone! This allows for even more witness.

Thanksgiving always occurs just before the season of Advent, a season in which we await with anticipation the God who comes to us in Jesus Christ to be with us. This is a theme that is important for the church. The Holidays are an important time, they are indeed Holy Days, but they can only be that fully if we are able to find moments to be with one another as a reflection of God's desire to be with us. It doesn't happen all the time or maybe as much as we would like. Certainly, this not a call to stop gift giving or having family meals! Those things are important, but being with one another matters too. And with the help of a well seasoned turkey and a digital read thermometer it has become a little bit easier to do.

A friend of Bethany Church, Rev. Sharon Stewart, was here recently to teach about the Spiritual Discipline of Noticing. She shared with me that she read about this practice in the book *Everyday Contemplative: The Way of Prayerful Living* by Roger Owens, a pastor and professor at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. As we prepare for a busy season of life, full of errands to run, people to visit, cookies to bake, and presents to wrap, I would like to pass on this wonderful and very practical Spiritual Discipline of Noticing.

First, how would you describe your current level of "paying attention" in life? To God? To Others? Second, take a moment to think about what gets in the way of noticing? Finally, think of a few ways that you can pay attention to God and how God is working in you and in your daily life.

If you read Mark 10:46-52, this is a story of Jesus noticing someone. He notices Bartimaeus. Our Lord never ceases to notices us. God never stops watching over us.

Take some time this month to walk through your neighborhood or a nearby park; or do this while you sit at home with the TV off and the phone put away; or even as you run errands, drive to work, or prepare a meal. Pause. What do you notice? What do you smell or hear? What feelings or emotions do you notice: anxiety, gratitude, doubt, joy, fear? Then ask yourself what you may need to let go of and trust God with that day. Take a few minutes to experience God's grace and love, and to feel his peace in the midst. Then, take a moment to reflect on how slowing down to notice can be helpful and encouraging, and how it serves as a reminder of God's all-encompassing love.

Divine Virtues by Doug Bovard

Sometimes when you are searching for something it drops right in your lap.

Lately, I have been in pursuit for...'What to write about in the November church newsletter...' Then,

Tabletalk's October addition arrived in the mail and my quest came to an end. Featured in Tabletalk

was the subject of "Lost Virtues." Virtues that have been marginalized if not flat out forgotten in
today's society.

Because virtues come from God, they have deep roots in the Christian church and have formed much of the basis for our Western civilization. Can words be a proxy for attitudes and culture? A study of documents going back 250 years saw a dramatic shift in the use of words in general publications. In 1770, the use of the word virtue far exceeded words like value and morals. This gradually changed over time. In today's lexicon, the use of the word value far exceeds the words virtue and moral. Values, which come from within us, are what is important now. I could go into the origin of this change by elaborating on humanistic religion, expressive individualism, cultural Marxism, pseudo-virtues, etc. but that is not what I want to explore in this series. Instead, let's delve into what the Scriptures teach us about virtues. I'll accomplish that by identifying examples of virtue and embrace the full array of divine virtues exemplified by our Lord Jesus Christ.

Looking ahead, Honor, Chastity, Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, Justice, Charity, Diligence, Patience, Kindness, Humility and Honesty are the divine virtues that I aspire to develop in some detail. With the help of the Holy Spirit, the Scriptures, the scholarly writings of others, and your prayers, I hope this series of articles redirects all of us to the blessings, beauty, and practice of divine virtues.
