Churches can become very good at preparing for evangelism yet never actually evangelize.

	A Gospel tract...
	<i>Never gets tired... never forgets Scripture... Can go places where you cannot... may be read days or months later...</i>
The Ethiopian	Acts 8:28 – "... returning, and sitting in his chariot read Esaias the prophet."
	Before Philip arrived, the man was reading the words of God.
	Our responsibility is to plant the seed of the word of God. (Luke 8:11)
Tract Testimony	Many believers can trace their salvation testimony back to a Gospel tract.
	God used a tract, a Bible left in hotel, a booklet, the radio, an invitation, etc.
	God delights in using simple and ordinary means to save people.

Judgment Seat	Imagine someday soon standing before Jesus Christ to give account...
	He asks, "I placed that person in your life for 8 years. What did you say?"
	Now consider your family, friends, neighbors, and all you pass by daily ...
Common Fears	"They will reject me I might say something wrong..."
	" I do not know enough to give answers... it will be too awkward for me ..."
	What is worse? Temporary embarrassment or eternity in hell + lake of fire?
Bible Examples	Peter feared men... then preached at Pentecost.
	Jonah was selfish... and Nineveh almost perished.
	Paul endured prison, beatings, stoning, rejection... and continued preaching!
Everyday Life	Gospel opportunities are everywhere...
	Restaurant server, cashier, wait in line, gas station, neighbor, school pickup,
	doctor's office, barber/salon, delivery driver, mail carrier, mechanic, hotel help,
Remember	park bench, libraries, stores, restrooms, community events...
	Someone's eternity is worth your inconvenience .
	God uses ordinary believers who simply obey and trust Him.
	Your small acts of faithfulness often produce _____ results.
