Learn About Destiny Rescue at Emmanuel on Sunday, August 30



Tomorrow, Sunday, August 30, Destiny Rescue will join us for our Mission Sunday. Destiny Rescue is a global organization dedicated to rescuing children from sexual exploitation and human trafficking and equipping them to stay free. Amy Johns serves as the Director of Strategic Partnerships at Destiny Rescue and recently traveled to

Thailand and Cambodia to visit Destiny Rescue's frontline teams. Amy will share first-hand stories of both the heartbreaking realities children face and the incredible hope that rescue brings.

During our Sunday School hour, 9:15-10:15 a.m., Amy will explain the global crisis of child trafficking, share how God is working through Destiny Rescue, and offer practical ways we can partner in bringing freedom and restoration to vulnerable children. Circles currently needs:

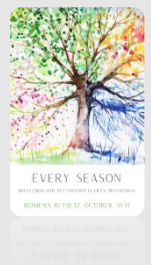
1. Volunteers to serve as a mentor to be paired with one person—it may not be easy, it is very rewarding!
