



“See and Hear” in the Scriptures

Exodus 3:7

Then the Lord said, “I have surely **seen** the affliction of my people who are in Egypt and have **heard** their cry because of their taskmasters. I know their sufferings,

Numbers 14:14

and they will tell the inhabitants of this land. They have **heard** that you, O Lord, are in the midst of this people. For you, O Lord, are **seen** face to face, and your cloud stands over them and you go before them, in a pillar of cloud by day and in a pillar of fire by night.

Deuteronomy 4:28

And there you will serve gods of wood and stone, the work of human hands, that neither **see**, nor **hear**, nor eat, nor smell.

Deuteronomy 4:36

Out of heaven he let you **hear** his voice, that he might discipline you. And on earth he let you **see** his great fire, and you **heard** his words out of the midst of the fire.

Deuteronomy 5:24

And you said, ‘Behold, the Lord our God has shown us his glory and greatness, and we have **heard** his voice out of the midst of the fire. This day we have **seen** God speak with man, and man still live.

Deuteronomy 18:16

just as you desired of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, ‘Let me not **hear** again the voice of the Lord my God or **see** this great fire any more, lest I die.’

Deuteronomy 29:4

But to this day the Lord has not given you a **heart** to understand or eyes to **see** or ears to **hear**.

2 Kings 19:16

Incline your ear, O Lord, and **hear**; open your eyes, O Lord, and **see**; and **hear** the words of Sennacherib, which he has sent to mock the living God.

2 Kings 20:5

“Turn back, and say to Hezekiah the leader of my people, Thus says the Lord, the God of David your father: I have **heard** your prayer; I have **seen** your tears. Behold, I will heal you. On the third day you shall go up to the house of the Lord,

1 Chronicles 28:8

Now therefore in the sight of all Israel, the assembly of the Lord, and in the **hearing** of our God, observe and **seek** out all the commandments of the Lord your God, that you may possess this good land and leave it for an inheritance to your children after you forever.

2 Chronicles 9:6

but I did not believe the reports until I came and my own eyes had **seen** it. And behold, half the greatness of your wisdom was not told me; you surpass the report that I **heard**.

Job 13:1

Job Continues: Still I Will Hope in God

“Behold, my eye has **seen** all this, my ear has **heard** and understood it.

Job 15:17

“I will show you; **hear** me, and what I have **seen** I will declare.

Job 42:5

I had **heard** of you by the **hearing** of the ear, but now my eye **sees** you;

Psalms 48:8

As we have **heard**, so have we **seen** in the city of the Lord of hosts, in the city of our God, which God will establish forever. Selah

Psalms 92:11

My eyes have **seen** the downfall of my enemies; my ears have **heard** the doom of my evil assailants.

Psalms 94:9

He who planted the ear, does he not **hear**? He who formed the eye, does he not **see**?

Ecclesiastes 1:8

All things are full of weariness; a man cannot utter it; the eye is not satisfied with **seeing**, nor the ear filled with **hearing**.

Song of Solomon 2:14

O my dove, in the clefts of the rock, in the crannies of the cliff, let me **see** your face, let me **hear** your voice, for your voice is sweet, and your face is lovely.

Isaiah 6:9

And he said, “Go, and say to this people: ““Keep on **hearing**, but do not understand; keep on **seeing**, but do not perceive.’

Isaiah 6:10

Make the **heart** of this people dull, and their ears heavy, and blind their eyes; lest they **see** with their eyes, and **hear** with their ears, and understand with their **hearts**, and turn and be healed.”

Isaiah 11:3

And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes **see**, or decide disputes by what his ears **hear**,

Isaiah 21:3

Therefore my loins are filled with anguish; pangs have seized me, like the pangs of a woman in labor; I am bowed down so that I cannot **hear**; I am dismayed so that I cannot **see**.

Isaiah 29:18

In that day the deaf shall **hear** the words of a book, and out of their gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind shall **see**.

Isaiah 30:30

And the Lord will cause his majestic voice to be **heard** and the descending blow of his arm to be **seen**, in furious anger and a flame of devouring fire, with a cloudburst and storm and hailstones.

Isaiah 32:3

Then the eyes of those who **see** will not be closed, and the ears of those who **hear** will give attention.

Isaiah 37:17

Incline your ear, O Lord, and **hear**; open your eyes, O Lord, and **see**; and **hear** all the words of Sennacherib, which he has sent to mock the living God.

Isaiah 38:5

“Go and say to Hezekiah, Thus says the Lord, the God of David your father: I have **heard** your prayer; I have **seen** your tears. Behold, I will add fifteen years to your life.

Isaiah 42:18

Israel's Failure to **Hear** and **See**

Hear, you deaf, and look, you blind, that you may **see**!

Isaiah 42:20

He **sees** many things, but does not observe them; his ears are open, but he does not **hear**.

Isaiah 44:18

They know not, nor do they discern, for he has shut their eyes, so that they cannot **see**, and their **hearts**, so that they cannot understand.

Isaiah 48:6

“You have **heard**; now **see** all this; and will you not declare it? From this time forth I announce to you new things, hidden things that you have not known.

Isaiah 52:15

so shall he sprinkle many nations. Kings shall shut their mouths because of him, for that which has not been told them they **see**, and that which they have not **heard** they understand.

Isaiah 64:4

From of old no one has **heard** or perceived by the ear, no eye has **seen** a God besides you, who acts for those who wait for him.

Isaiah 66:8

Who has **heard** such a thing? Who has **seen** such things? Shall a land be born in one day? Shall a nation be brought forth in one moment? For as soon as Zion was in labor she brought forth her children.

Isaiah 66:19

and I will set a sign among them. And from them I will send survivors to the nations, to Tarshish, Pul, and Lud, who draw the bow, to Tubal and Javan, to the coastlands far away, that have not **heard** my fame or **seen** my glory. And they shall declare my glory among the nations.

Jeremiah 4:21

How long must I **see** the standard and **hear** the sound of the trumpet?

Jeremiah 5:21

“**Hear** this, O foolish and senseless people, who have eyes, but **see** not, who have ears, but **hear** not.

Jeremiah 23:18

For who among them has stood in the council of the Lord to **see** and to **hear** his word, or who has paid attention to his word and listened?

Jeremiah 42:14

and saying, ‘No, we will go to the land of Egypt, where we shall not **see** war or **hear** the sound of the trumpet or be hungry for bread, and we will dwell there,’

Lamentations 1:18

“The Lord is in the right, for I have rebelled against his word; but **hear**, all you peoples, and **see** my suffering; my young women and my young men have gone into captivity.

Ezekiel 12:2

“Son of man, you dwell in the midst of a rebellious house, who have eyes to **see**, but **see** not, who have ears to **hear**, but **hear** not, for they are a rebellious house.

Ezekiel 40:4

And the man said to me, “Son of man, look with your eyes, and **hear** with your ears, and set your **heart** upon all that I shall show you, for you were brought here in order that I might show it to you. Declare all that you **see** to the house of Israel.”

Ezekiel 44:5

And the Lord said to me, “Son of man, mark well, **see** with your eyes, and **hear** with your ears all that I shall tell you concerning all the statutes of the temple of the Lord and all its laws. And mark well the entrance to the temple and all the exits from the sanctuary.

Daniel 5:23

but you have lifted up yourself against the Lord of heaven. And the vessels of his house have been brought in before you, and you and your lords, your wives, and your concubines have drunk wine from them. And you have praised the gods of silver and gold, of bronze, iron, wood, and stone, which do not **see** or **hear** or know, but the God in whose hand is your breath, and whose are all your ways, you have not honored.

Daniel 9:18

O my God, incline your ear and **hear**. Open your eyes and **see** our desolations, and the city that is called by your name. For we do not present our pleas before you because of our righteousness, but because of your great mercy.

Matthew 11:4

And Jesus answered them, “Go and tell John what you **hear** and **see**:

Matthew 13:13

This is why I speak to them in parables, because **seeing** they do not **see**, and **hearing** they do not **hear**, nor do they understand.

Matthew 13:14

Indeed, in their case the prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled that says: ““You will indeed **hear** but never understand, and you will indeed **see** but never perceive.”

Matthew 13:15

For this people's **heart** has grown dull, and with their ears they can barely **hear**, and their eyes they have closed, lest they should **see** with their eyes and **hear** with their ears and understand with their **heart** and turn, and I would heal them.’

Matthew 13:17

For truly, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to **see** what you **see**, and did not **see** it, and to **hear** what you **hear**, and did not **hear** it.

Mark 4:12

so that ““they may indeed **see** but not perceive, and may indeed **hear** but not understand, lest they should turn and be forgiven.””

Mark 8:18

Having eyes do you not **see**, and having ears do you not **hear**? And do you not remember?

Mark 12:28

The Great Commandment

And one of the scribes came up and **heard** them disputing with one another, and **seeing** that he answered them well, asked him, “Which commandment is the most important of all?”

Mark 16:11

But when they **heard** that he was alive and had been **seen** by her, they would not believe it.

Luke 2:20

And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had **heard** and **seen**, as it had been told them.

Luke 7:22

And he answered them, “Go and tell John what you have **seen** and **heard**: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf **hear**, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news preached to them.

Luke 8:10

he said, “To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God, but for others they are in parables, so that ‘**seeing** they may not **see**, and **hearing** they may not understand.’

Luke 10:24

For I tell you that many prophets and kings desired to **see** what you **see**, and did not **see** it, and to **hear** what you **hear**, and did not **hear** it.”

Luke 23:8

When Herod saw Jesus, he was very glad, for he had long desired to **see** him, because he had **heard** about him, and he was hoping to **see** some sign done by him.

John 3:32

He bears witness to what he has **seen** and **heard**, yet no one receives his testimony.

John 5:37

And the Father who sent me has himself borne witness about me. His voice you have never **heard**, his form you have never **seen**,

John 8:38

I speak of what I have **seen** with my Father, and you do what you have **heard** from your father.”

Acts 2:33

Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are **seeing** and **hearing**.

Acts 4:20

for we cannot but speak of what we have **seen** and **heard**.”

Acts 7:34

I have surely **seen** the affliction of my people who are in Egypt, and have **heard** their groaning, and I have come down to deliver them. And now come, I will send you to Egypt.'

Acts 9:7

The men who were traveling with him stood speechless, **hearing** the voice but **seeing** no one.

Acts 19:26

And you **see** and **hear** that not only in Ephesus but in almost all of Asia this Paul has persuaded and turned away a great many people, saying that gods made with hands are not gods.

Acts 22:14

And he said, 'The God of our fathers appointed you to know his will, to **see** the Righteous One and to **hear** a voice from his mouth;

Acts 22:15

for you will be a witness for him to everyone of what you have **seen** and **heard**.

Acts 28:26

“Go to this people, and say, “You will indeed **hear** but never understand, and you will indeed **see** but never perceive.”

Acts 28:27

For this people's **heart** has grown dull, and with their ears they can barely **hear**, and their eyes they have closed; lest they should **see** with their eyes and **hear** with their ears and understand with their **heart** and turn, and I would heal them.'

Romans 11:8

as it is written, “God gave them a spirit of stupor, eyes that would not **see** and ears that would not **hear**, down to this very day.”

Romans 15:21

but as it is written, “Those who have never been told of him will **see**, and those who have never **heard** will understand.”

1 Corinthians 2:9

But, as it is written, “What no eye has **seen**, nor ear **heard**, nor the **heart** of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him” —

2 Corinthians 12:6

though if I should wish to boast, I would not be a fool, for I would be speaking the truth; but I refrain from it, so that no one may think more of me than he **sees** in me or **hears** from me.

Philippians 1:27

Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and **see** you or am absent, I may **hear** of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel,

Philippians 4:9

What you have learned and received and **heard** and **seen** in me—practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.

1 Thessalonians 2:17

Paul's Longing to **See** Them Again

But since we were torn away from you, brothers, for a short time, in person not in **heart**, we endeavored the more eagerly and with great desire to **see** you face to face,

James 5:11

Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have **heard** of the steadfastness of Job, and you have **seen** the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

1 John 1:1

The Word of Life

That which was from the beginning, which we have **heard**, which we have **seen** with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—

1 John 1:3

that which we have **seen** and **heard** we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.

Revelation 9:20

The rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, did not repent of the works of their hands nor give up worshiping demons and idols of gold and silver and bronze and stone and wood, which cannot **see** or **hear** or walk,

Revelation 22:8

I, John, am the one who **heard** and **saw** these things. And when I **heard** and **saw** them, I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who showed them to me,
