Review Text: John 9:1-12

- It was observed in the sermon that “Before this man ever sees Jesus, Jesus sees him.” What does that reveal about Jesus and His grace? How does knowing that Jesus sees and cares for you change the way you view yourself and your circumstances?
- The disciples looked at the man’s suffering and asked, “Who sinned?” Jesus directed their attention toward what God was going to do. When you encounter suffering or brokenness, what do you tend to focus on—“Why did this happen?” and “Who is to blame?” or “What might God be doing?” Why is it difficult to shift our eyes toward Jesus?
- Jesus’ healing of the blind man points beyond the miracle to the day when He will “make all things new.” How does the promise of new creation give you hope in the specific brokenness, suffering, grief, or uncertainty you experience now?
- The man was physically changed before he fully understood who Jesus was. What evidence can you see of Jesus’ transforming work in your own life? How has following Jesus changed what you love, how you see the world, or where you place your hope?
- The healed man’s changed life became a visible testimony that made other people ask, “What happened?” What does it look like for your life to be “God’s work on display,” and who around you might God be giving you an opportunity to point toward Jesus?
