### NEW CLASS: The Gospel in Culture | Various Facilitators | Room 2107

Join us for thoughtful, engaging conversations at the intersection of faith and culture. Each week begins with a short video from Thing Media (formerly Q Ideas). After the presentation, we'll participate in guided discussion—creating space to process ideas, ask honest questions, spark insight and challenge the way we think. Each session features a new topic aimed at helping us think biblically, live faithfully, and lead courageously in a culture that doesn't always align with Christian convictions. Come ready to listen, learn, and grow alongside others seeking to live out their faith with wisdom and confidence. **Class runs through May 31.**

May 3 – **What is Truth? (Susan Harrison)** - The world has many perspectives on what is true, right, and good. Some believe truth is subjective. How do we, as Christians, discern what is true and then live out those Biblical truths in our relationships and spheres of influence?

May 10 – **The Theology of Cyborgs (Stuart Campbell)** – Advances in the fields of AI and Robotics is rapidly changing our world. And while technology can be a useful tool, it must never redefine our identity, replace our dependence on God, or distort what it means to be human.

May 17 – **Confronting Our Technology Addiction (Curt Ruhlman)** - Technology is shaping our habits and hearts. Are we losing our ability to listen, learn, and connect?

May 24 – **The Idol of Productivity (Cathy Russell)** – Does the modern obsession with constant output shape your identity and everyday choices? What are the hidden costs of always striving to do more, and how this mindset can quietly take over what matters most? Together we will rethink productivity and rediscover a more meaningful, Biblically-centered way to live.

May 31 – **New Age Spirituality (Susan Harrison)** - The Bible tells us that our God is jealous for His people and that we are to worship God only. There are many spiritual practices in the world today that Christians may or may not realize are drawing on powers that are not of God and ultimately are harmful. What are these practices? What is wrong with them? How can we know? What do we do about it?

### The Life of Moses (Part 3) Numbers: Trials in the Wilderness and Divine Guidance (conducted in Mandarin) | Selina Li | Bride's Room

The Book of Numbers records Israel's journey from Mount Sinai to the edge of the Promised Land, highlighting both God's faithfulness and His people's struggles with faith and obedience. Through narratives, laws, and key events, we will see how God shapes His people, teaches them to trust Him, and prepares them for His promises. As we study Numbers, we will reflect on our own spiritual journey—learning to rely on God in times of testing, to grow in obedience, and to remain faithful in the process of transformation.
