Sermon: We Believe God Speaks

Scripture: 2 Timothy 3:14-17

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¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom^[a] you learned it ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

Reflection Questions:

1. According to 2 Timothy 3:16-17, what does it mean that all Scripture is "God-breathed," and how should that shape the way we approach God's Word?
2. Which of the four activities of God's Word (teaching, reproof, correction, or training in righteousness) do you most need from God right now, and why?
3. Psalm 19 says God's Word revives the soul, makes the simple wise, rejoices the heart, and enlightens the eyes. Which of these promises do you most long to experience? What might that look like in your life?
4. In John 16:13-15, Jesus says the Holy Spirit will guide believers into truth and glorify Christ. How does this passage shape your understanding of the relationship between Scripture, the Holy Spirit, and Jesus?
5. Paul describes the mystery now revealed as "Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27). What does this truth reveal about God's purpose in making Himself known through His Word?

Guided Prayer:

Praise God for speaking by His Word. Ask God to illuminate your heart and mind to understand, and most importantly, live according to God's Word. Ask Him to show you areas of your life where you are not living according to God's Word. Repent of those things and ask God to help you to "be transformed by the renewing of your mind." Thank God for His grace and love for you. Commit to live according to His Word. In Jesus' name, Amen.
