

Following Jesus in Real Life *Called to Worship*

Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train^[a] of his robe filled the temple. 2 Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. 3 And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"^[b] 4 And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. 5 And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" 6 Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. 7 And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for." 8 And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me."

Reflection Questions:

- What do you learn about who God is and how to worship Him from this passage?
- How do you see God's glory in your life? Where do you sense or see His presence?
- What sin are you minimizing right now that Isaiah's "woe is me" moment is calling you to name before God?
- If God asked, "Whom shall I send?" in the specific context of your ordinary Monday, what would make you hesitate to say, "here I am"?
- In what area of your life have you been sitting in the audience when God has been inviting you to participate?

Guided Prayer:

Spend some time following the logic of this passage: Praise God for who He is (vs 1-4). Repent for your sin (vs 5). Receive His forgiveness (vs 6-7). Offer yourself to Him (vs 8).
