

Sermon: Micah: What Do You Want from Me?

Scripture: Micah 6:6-8

*“With what shall I come before the Lord,
and bow myself before God on high?
Shall I come before him with burnt offerings,
with calves a year old?
⁷ Will the Lord be pleased with^[a] thousands of rams,
with ten thousands of rivers of oil?
Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression,
the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?”
⁸ He has told you, O man, what is good;
and what does the Lord require of you
but to do justice, and to love kindness,
and to walk humbly with your God?*

Reflection Questions:

- Where am I offering God religious activity instead of justice, steadfast love and a humble, daily walk with Him?
- How does God’s steadfast love for us fuel our steadfast love for Him and for others?
- What are some specific ways I can live out God’s justice this week? What would I do differently?
- In what ways do I rely more on myself rather than humbly depend on God?
- How does the hope we have in Christ change the way I live today?

Guided Prayer:

Thank God for His grace that covers what you cannot repay. Confess where your life has drifted from justice, mercy, or humility. Ask the Spirit to show you one relationship or situation where you can make righteousness visible this week. Pray for a heart softened by God’s steadfast love so that you may walk humbly with Him in every part of your life. Rest in the promise that He delights in compassion and casts your sins into the depths of the sea through Christ. In Jesus’ name, Amen.
