COVID Update: CDC June 16, 2022 Community level is MEDIUM in Winchester & LOW in Frederick Co.,VA. *If you are at high risk for severe illness, consider wearing a mask indoors in public and taking additional precautions.

- *Stay <u>up to date</u> with COVID-19 vaccines and booster/s
- *Get tested if you have symptoms.
- *Wear a mask if you have symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID 19. Wear a mask on <u>public transportation</u>. You may choose to wear a mask at any time as an additional precaution to protect yourself & others.

Health Education - 2 Corinthians 1:4a God comforts us in all our afflictions, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction.

Be Cool...Avoid Heat Stroke As temperatures soar in July & August, so do incidences of heat-related illness. Heat stroke or sunstroke can cause brain damage and even death, if not treated immediately. The body becomes unable to regulate its own temperature, which may rise above 105 degrees.

Every age group is at risk. Older folks, especially those living alone, should be aware of signs of heat stroke.

Heat Stroke Signs:

- * Fainting or feeling unsteady or dizzy
- * Changes in behavior (confusion or delirium)
- * Body temperatures more than 101 degrees
- *Dry, red/flushed skin
- *Headache
- *Strong, rapid pulse or slow weak pulse
- *Lack of perspiration/sweat despite heat
- *Nausea
- *Unconsciousness/coma

What Should You Do? If you suspect someone is suffering from heat stroke, CALL 911. While waiting for emergency services, move the victim to an air-conditioned or shady area. Put the individual in a cool bath/shower or cover the person with wet towels or sheets. If conscious, offer the person sips of cool water or juice.

Heat Stroke Prevention: The best way to prevent heat stroke is to avoid becoming overheated and to stay well-hydrated, avoiding beverages with alcohol, sugar, and caffeine, which contribute to dehydration. Other tips include:

- *Use air-conditioning or spend at least 2 hours daily in a place that has air-conditioning
- *Draw blinds or curtains during the sunny part of the day
- *Cut back on using heat-generating appliances
- *Wear lightweight, loose clothes that allow perspiration to evaporate *Wear sunscreen, insect repellant, & a wide brimmed hat
- *Avoid being outside during high sun times, limit outdoor activities
- *Avoid closed-in or crowded places, especially ones that are not air-conditioned

For people living alone, find a buddy or someone to check in with on a regular basis, Sources: American Red Cross, MedicineNet.com, National Institute on Aging
