Health Education: Physical Activity for your Health! 3 John 1:2 Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, just as it is well with your soul."

The US CDC recommends 150 minutes of physical activity per week for adults ages 18-64. Just about every part of your body can benefit from physical activity. To add physical activity into your daily schedule:

- Select enjoyable activities
- Work out with a friend
- Encourage family members to participate
- Measure progress through a daily exercise journal

According to CDC, exercise also helps:

- Maintain healthy weight
- Reduce the risk of cardiovascular disease; can lower blood pressure and improve cholesterol levels
- Reduce the risk for Type 2 diabetes; can help control glucose levels
- Reduce the risk of colon & breast cancer
- Strengthen bones & muscles can increase or build muscle mass and strength; can slow the loss of bone density that comes with age; can help with arthritis & other joint conditions
- Keep thinking, learning, and judgement skills sharp
- Reduce the symptoms of depression and anxiety

This program is called Children's Encounter, and is held each Sunday morning in the second floor children's room. from Bishop Lewis informing us that VAUMC received an urgent call from UMCOR requesting cleaning kits. UMCOR Supply Depots are already close to disbursing all their stored cleaning kits to impacted areas. In 2017, the VA Conference responded to a similar call and collected 4,676 cleaning kits. The VAUMC Annual Conference Kit team proposes to hold another event on Nov. 10. Bishop Lewis requests that each church contribute 4 cleaning kits and be "United as One" in this opportunity to share the hope of Jesus Christ. UWF will coordinate with Reach & Serve to again sponsor this request for at least 4 cleaning kits from KUMC as we did in the Spring. This collection will take place during October. 




