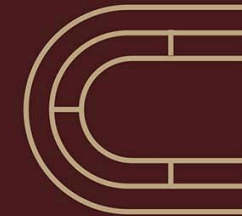

- FriendSpeak trained a total of 69 people in March! Over 50 Workers attended a training at the Garden Ridge Church of Christ in Lewisville, TX.
- We held a couple of special online training events for college students going on LST Projects and recruited 14 LST alumni to help.
- Mackayla Rodriguez is creating an online tool for LST Projects – a one-stop place that teams can go to see what they still need to do, what important information LST has sent to them recently, etc. It's also a place staff can go to see what still needs to be done for any team – training, ticketing, site logistics, etc.
- Two LST teams have completed their Projects. Five more leave this month (April).
- The monthly "Exploring LST" info sessions continue to bear fruit in terms of people not only learning about LST but then taking practical steps to get involved.



A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

Which is better? Yours or His?

The tension between asserting one's own will and surrendering to God's will lies at the heart of the spiritual life described in the Bible. Human nature tends toward self-direction—seeking control, autonomy, and personal fulfillment. Yet Scripture consistently calls believers to a higher posture: yielding personal desires in trustful obedience to God.

To substitute one's will in place of God's will is to prioritize personal ambition in a way that conflicts with divine guidance. This impulse is evident in Genesis 3:6, where Adam and Eve choose their own judgment over God's command. Their decision reflects a fundamental struggle—valuing self-rule above divine wisdom. Similarly, Proverbs 14:12 warns, "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death," underscoring the danger of relying solely on human understanding.

In contrast, surrendering to God's will involves humility, trust, and obedience. Proverbs 3:5-6 instructs believers to "trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding." This surrender is not passive resignation but active alignment with God's purposes. The ultimate example is found in Matthew 26:39, where Jesus prays, "Not as I will, but as You will," demonstrating perfect submission even in suffering.

The contrast reveals a profound truth: self-will often leads to confusion and separation from God, while surrender leads to peace and purpose. Romans 12:2 calls for transformation through the renewal of the mind, enabling believers to discern God's "good, pleasing, and perfect will."

Ultimately, choosing God's will over one's own is an act of faith that orients everyday circumstances and decisions toward one's eternal nature rather than temporary satisfaction.
