Missions

Thank you to those of you who contributed to our friend, Anyulys, in Venezuela to help with the destruction caused by the recent earthquake. Here is a WhatsApp message from her that included 2 additional videos of additional supplies she purchased. If you would like to see the videos, don't hesitate to ask Bob or Teresa Pusey. It is very encouraging to see Christians bearing one another's burdens all the way from here to Venezuela.

Hello Mr. Robert,

This was the first purchase we made. The greatest need is for medical supplies such as face masks, gloves, rubbing alcohol, and cotton. There is also a serious sanitation problem because of the large amount of debris and waste left behind after the earthquake. As a result, heavy-duty trash bags are urgently needed to help with cleanup efforts and to reduce health risks. Many people are sleeping on the streets or in temporary shelters, and they urgently need bed sheets, pillows, and mattresses. We also purchased milk and food for babies. We bought flashlights and special protective masks for the volunteers and rescue workers who are still clearing away the rubble. One important thing about the donations is that the word "DONATION" should be written on each item, and the barcode should be crossed out or covered to prevent the items from being resold later.

Everything was sent to Caracas today. We are praying that it will reach the people who need it most very soon and that it will be a blessing to many. Once again, thank you so much for your generous support. May God continue to bless your life and multiply everything you give to others. God bless you.



A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

Singing praise to God is a joyful expression of worship that honors Him and strengthens His people. Throughout Scripture, believers are encouraged to praise God in song because He is worthy of all glory and thanksgiving. The psalmist wrote, "It is good to give thanks to the Lord, and to sing praises to Your name, O Most High" (Psalm 92:1).

Singing praise songs help believers focus on God's goodness, faithfulness, and love. They also encourage and unite Christians as they worship together. Paul instructed the church to teach and encourage one another "in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Colossians 3:16). Likewise, Ephesians 5:19 calls Christians to sing and make melody in their hearts to the Lord, demonstrating sincere and joyful worship.

Singing praise also strengthens faith during difficult times. While imprisoned, Paul and Silas prayed and sang hymns to God, showing that praise is rooted in trust rather than circumstances (Acts 16:25). Their example reminds believers that worship can bring hope and courage even in trials.

Praise glorifies God and proclaims His greatness. Hebrews 13:15 encourages Christians to "continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to His name." Through songs of praise, believers honor God, encourage one another, and draw closer to Him with thankful hearts.
