A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

In the past two Shepherd's Corner articles, we've examined how the concepts of worship, praise, and singing and how they are fundamental and go hand in hand with corporate worship times of the congregation. In light of that reality a question currently under consideration is: Are there opportunities to improve our intentionality in this area during our congregational time together, and if so, would they be useful?

One concept currently being considered here at CK is the introduction of a Praise and Harmony group. Other congregations that have introduced Praise and Harmony groups find their efforts to be a meaningful way to encourage participation, strengthen fellowship, and glorify God through song. Such a group is not intended to perform for an audience but to support the congregation in heartfelt worship. By emphasizing strong, balanced harmonies and clear singing, the group can help teach unfamiliar hymns, reinforce traditional favorites, and encourage confidence among those who may be new to the congregation or hesitant to sing.

Scripture reminds Christians to "teach and admonish one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs" (Colossians 3:16) and to sing "with the spirit and with the understanding also" (1 Corinthians 14:15). A praise and harmony group can serve these biblical purposes by helping the congregation focus on the message of the songs while offering an example of joyful, reverent worship. Successful praise and harmony groups select individuals not only for their musical ability but also for their Christian character, humility, and desire to serve as collectively they strive to make a "joyful noise unto the Lord" (Psalm 100:1). Their role is to direct attention to God rather than themselves. When guided by biblical principles and a spirit of unity, a praise and harmony group can be a valuable asset that enriches congregational singing and supports the church's worship time together.

The Shepherds request your prayers and feedback as we evaluate the possibility and logistics of forming a Praise and Harmony group comprised of CK members to help the congregation engage in heartfelt singing during our Sunday morning worship times.

As of this report LST has 131 Workers locked on 41 Projects for 2026 (total for 2025 was 165 Workers on 44 Projects).



We initiated a 7-week summer session of LST Connect as a way of encouraging new or reactivated Workers to participate in LST Connect this year. With a very limited recruiting window, 8 Workers (5 of whom are new or reactivated) jumped on board. They are working with 9 Readers (most of whom had been on a waiting list). Workers and Readers will receive a digital completion certificate from LST at the end of the 7-week session.

DBCC's newest tradition: Family Encampment! This year's theme is Building Christian Community, and we hope you'll join us for a weekend of worship, fellowship, encouraging lessons from leaders of Churches of Christ throughout the Pacific Northwest, family activities, and time together in one of God's most beautiful settings. Whether you're able to spend the entire weekend or only join us for part of it, we'd love to have you there. The cost is \$30 per adult and \$20 per child. A limited number of seaside cabins are available for \$50 per night on a first-come, first-served basis, and RV sites are also available by request.
