A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

Striking a Biblical Balance

Both the Old and New Testaments communicate God's desire for mankind to demonstrate loving-kindness and generosity, and that His desire is both innate and timeless. One cannot claim to serve Christ without also looking to the needs of others. Such love develops humility and patience within us, and bears witness to the world of Christ's sovereignty.

Scripture consistently teaches that Christians are to place the needs of others above their own. Philippians 2:3-4 instructs believers to do nothing through selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility to consider others more significant than themselves, looking not only to one's own interests, but also to the interests of others. This spirit of selfless service reflects the love of Christ and strengthens the bonds among God's family.

At the same time, Scripture does not teach that Christians should ignore their own physical, emotional, or spiritual needs. Jesus regularly withdrew to quiet places to pray and renew His strength (Mark 1:35; Luke 5:16), demonstrating the importance of maintaining a close relationship with the Father. We are also commanded to love our neighbors "as yourself" (Mark 12:31), recognizing that healthy self-care enables one to care more effectively for others. Thus, one must balance acts of loving-kindness and generosity with wise self-care in order to be better prepared to bless others, guided by the Holy Spirit, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior, to the glory of God the Father.

Help for Flooding in Uvalde, Texas: Uvalde, Texas has reported over 230 rescued after a historic flood came through that community Wednesday, July 15th, forcing many evacuations. The waters have subsided some, but it may not be over yet, with possible additional water coming into Uvalde from the north. Early tomorrow morning, about 7am, a 53' trailer full of supplies will be leaving our Nashville warehouse, headed to Uvalde to be unloaded by members of the Getty St Church of Christ, Monday morning around 10a.m. Please keep the families in Uvalde in your prayers, as they start their clean-up of their community.

Shipment of Supplies to Aspen Acres Fire, in Colorado: Yesterday afternoon, July 6, a truck departed our Nashville warehouse, heading to the Southwest Church of Christ, in Pueblo, CO. Pueblo is about 33 miles Northeast of Rye, Colorado, and Rye was evacuated after the Aspen Acres Fire was discovered there June 29th at 7:19 a.m. At this time it is approximately 15% contained, and has burned 93,915 acres. The issue often with wildfires is, we know where the fire is, but we don't know where all of the people have gone. In this case, the preacher from the Southwest church in Pueblo contacted us, to let us know that many of the families that evacuated from Rye, are in Pueblo, and that they could use the pre-packed food boxes, personal hygiene boxes, infant care boxes, new clothing, new shoes now. Once the evacuation is lifted and they can return to Rye to see if their homes are still standing, that's when they'll need the cleaning supplies we provide. We don't have a firm time when the truck will arrive in Pueblo, but it most likely will be late this afternoon, July 7th, or it could unload first thing tomorrow morning, on July 8th. Also if you live in the Nashville area, and are available Thursday morning, July 9th, we will be running our food line, and packing 1,500 family food boxes that morning at 10 a.m. at our warehouse. If you can be on your feet for several hours, we could use your help at our warehouse at 410 Allied Dr in Nashville, at 10 a.m. Thursday to help us stay prepared for the next disaster.
