Bible Study at 7

A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDER:

Paul's journey to Rome really began with his arrival in Jerusalem at the end of his 3rd missionary journey. You can read about Paul's arrival, his arrest, his trials, the various plots to kill him, and his journey to Rome beginning in Acts 21:17 through the end of the book.

In the narrative, all the authorities practiced deception in one form or another:

- The Jewish authorities who falsely charged Paul with various crimes.

These same authorities twice asked the Romans to transfer Paul to Jerusalem for trial, while secretly intending to ambush him and kill him along the way.

- The Roman Commander who put Paul in chains and was about to flog him before finding out that Paul was a Roman citizen. He later wrote to his superiors that "I came with my troops and rescued him, for I had learned that he is a Roman citizen" (Acts 22:29; 23:27).
- The governor, Felix, who promised to decide Paul's case quickly but left him in prison after 2 years, all the while hoping for a bribe (Acts 24:22-27).
- The governor, Festus, who knew Paul was innocent but, as a favor to the Jews, tried to transfer him to Jerusalem (Acts 25:9-10). He then lied to King Agrippa about his reasons for requesting the transfer (Acts 25:20).

Then, as now, it was common practice to "embellish" the truth, change the order of events, not follow through on promises made, leave certain events out, and lie about intentions. But in the final judgement, none of this trickery is going to work. God, who sees and knows all will "judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart". Indeed "Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account" (Heb 4:12-13). Perhaps Paul was talking about this very thing, when governor Felix became afraid and said, "That's enough for now! You may leave. When I find it convenient, I will send for you" (Acts 24:25).

Since we are all destined to stand before Christ's judgement seat, make it your ambition to live in such a way that you may, without shame or hesitation, always tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth (no "embellishments"). This shows that you follow the one who described himself as "the way, the truth and the life" (John 14:6) and brings him glory.
