# Living on Purpose

Week 8

## Day 1: The Editor of Your Story

Reading: 2 Samuel 22:1-7

We all curate the narrative of our lives, selecting which memories define us. David understood that the way we frame our story matters profoundly. When he looked back on years of triumph and tragedy, he chose to begin with God's faithfulness rather than his circumstances. The waves of death swirled around him, yet his first response was to call out to God. What lens are you using to view your past? Are you allowing pain, disappointment, or failure to write your headlines? Today, consider this: God may be the Author of your story, but when you let feelings dictate your frame, you distort the truth. Begin reframing your memories through the lens of God's presence, provision, and persistent love. Your focus determines your frame.

## Week 8

### Day 2: When God Reaches Down

Reading: 2 Samuel 22:17-20

"He reached down from on high and took hold of me." What a powerful image of divine intervention. David didn't rescue himself; God reached into his chaos and pulled him out. Notice David's conclusion: "He rescued me because he delighted in me." Not because David was perfect, but because God delights in His children. You may feel like you're drowning in deep waters today—overwhelming circumstances, powerful enemies, disasters that confronted you when you were least prepared. But God's delight in you isn't based on your performance. He reaches down not because you've earned it, but because you're His. Stop trying to climb out on your own strength. Call out to Him. Let Him draw you into a spacious place where His support becomes your foundation.

### Day 3: The Faithfulness Frame

Reading: Psalm 136:1-9, 23-26

"His love endures forever." This refrain echoes twenty-six times in Psalm 136, creating an unmistakable frame through which to view all of life. Creation? His love endures. Deliverance? His love endures. Provision? His love endures. When you frame your story through God's faithfulness rather than your feelings, everything changes. Your memories can either hurt you or help you—it all depends on the frame. Are you replaying past wounds as evidence of abandonment, or as testimonies of survival through God's sustaining grace? The facts of what happened don't change, but the interpretation transforms everything. Today, practice reframing one difficult memory. Acknowledge the pain, but then ask: Where was God's faithfulness present even then? What did He preserve, provide, or protect? Let gratitude reshape your narrative.

### **Day 4: Imperfect People, Perfect God**

Reading: 2 Samuel 22:26-37

David sang about his blamelessness, yet we know his story includes adultery, murder, and failed fatherhood. How could he sing this song? Because he understood that God's salvation confirms our relationship with Him, not our perfection. When God delivers you, He's declaring His commitment to you despite your failures. God turns your darkness into light. He makes your feet secure. He trains you for battles you couldn't face alone. Your past mistakes don't disqualify you from God's faithfulness. In fact, they magnify it. Where you've been weak, He's been strong. Where you've stumbled, He's kept you from complete collapse. Stop letting guilt edit out God's grace from your story. The headline isn't your failure; it's His unfailing kindness that continues beyond your worst moments into all your tomorrows.

### Day 5: Living Forward in Faith

Reading: Romans 8:31-39

If God is for us, who can be against us? Paul asks the ultimate reframing question. He doesn't deny trouble, hardship, persecution, or danger. Instead, he places them in proper perspective: none of these things can separate us from God's love demonstrated in Christ Jesus. This is your confidence moving forward. You don't have to wait to see if God will be faithful—He already proved it at the cross. Jesus provided your deliverance in advance. You are adopted, loved, and fought for by the King of heaven. So how will you frame your future? Through fear of what might happen, or through faith in the One who's already overcome? Today, declare over your life what David declared over his: "The Lord lives! Praise be to my Rock!" Let this be the song you sing repeatedly, the frame through which you view everything ahead.
