- **Water cycle and weather**: God describes hail, rain, snow, and dew with stunning detail. Meteorologists discovered those systems thousands of years later.
- **Behemoth and Leviathan**: These creatures may reference hippos, crocs, or even dinosaurs. Either way, they reflect God's unmatched creativity and power.

Exodus 33:18–23: Moses asks, "Show me Your glory."

God's answer? "I'll let My **goodness** pass before you. But you can't handle the full face of My glory."

- **His glory is more than light**: It's His moral beauty, His mercy, justice, and truth.
- **The cleft in the rock**: God hides Moses, shielding him. That's protection and revelation. Many see this as a **foreshadowing of Christ**.
- **Transformation follows encounter**: Exodus 34 says Moses' face **glowed**. He didn't just get information—he got **altered**.

So what do we do with all this?

Awe → Reverence → Worship → Surrender

Paul writes to a people who are saved but still stuck in cultural patterns. He calls them back to identity and truth: "You're not just saved—you're sacred. You're not common—you're a **temple**."

He confronts their compromise with a higher call. In essence, Paul says, "You're acting like you still belong to the world, but your body belongs to the King. Your soul is real estate for the Holy Spirit."

Your Body Is a Temple

In the Old Testament, the temple was everything—the center of worship, sacrifice, and glory. Inside the temple was the Holy of Holies, where only the high priest could go once a year to make atonement. That space was sacred, untouchable. Now, because of Jesus, that space isn't made of bricks—it's made of **flesh and spirit**. It's you.

You don't need to go to a building to access God's presence. You are the building. You don't need to wait on revival to fall. You bring it with you.

3. Live With Awareness

When you step into a room, revival steps in. When you speak truth, heaven echoes. You're not average—you're an **anointed agent** of God. Carry that awareness into boardrooms, classrooms, courtrooms, and neighborhoods.

4. Surrender Daily

Power doesn't flow from pride. It flows from surrender. When you say, "Not my will, but Yours," heaven responds. When you die to self, you awaken to supernatural strength.
