LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

We are enjoying a fruitful summer at Church of the Saviour! We've had a lot of great energy around the campus, thanks to our kids camps and summer interns, and we've heard many stories of fresh encounters with Jesus! We are also learning a lot about the heart of God and how to trust Him more deeply through our sermon series in the book of Joshua. Thank you for being so welcoming to Pastor Fred Harvey, from Spirit and Truth Fellowship, when he preached last month. He wrote to tell me how much he enjoyed both preaching at COS and having great conversations with many of you. We will continue learning from the ups and downs of the nation of Israel as our series progresses through mid-October.

As we prepare for the fall, I wanted to recap something that Kevin spoke about at Vision Day. He preached on the parable of the lost sheep from the gospel of Luke chapter 15. As you recall, the shepherd in the story leaves the flock of ninety-nine to find the one sheep that was lost. Of course, this great story is a metaphor for Jesus going after the lost sinner.

"Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it?" ~Luke 15:4

Kevin pointed out that God does not wait passively for lost sinners to come to him, but He actively seeks them out. The

Good Shepherd is intentional about finding the lost sheep, and the Father responds with joy when Jesus carries a repentant sinner home!

As a church, our desire is to align all that we do with the heart of God. The theme that Pastor Kevin shared on Vision Day was "For the One." In his sermon, he emphasized that "we are evaluating all that we do [as a church] with the one lost person in mind rather than the ninety-nine. We are going to strive to become a Luke 15 church."

Engaging in the mission of God is one of our highest callings and greatest privileges. It is where the action and the satisfaction dwell. As Jose reinforced last week, God made us the ambassadors for His plan of redemption in our world. We were the lost sheep that Jesus rescued, and we want to be used by God to call other lost souls to Him.

As we look forward to September, all of us have a unique part to play in God's mission. We all have a place where we can contribute our time, immense talents, and abundant treasure – "For the One."

REACHINTERNATIONAL YARD SALE FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

How can you help make international students feel more at home while they study in the United States? Thomas Jacob shared his experience when he was an international student in 2017.

"It was the summer before my first trip out of the country of my birth. I had put in my resignation at work and was grooming other team members to continue the work I had begun. I had decided to take Villanova University's offer of admission into its graduate engineering program. I was going to be an international student! Soon, I was juggling my free time between saying goodbye to close friends, spending time with family, and shopping for things that I would need to begin life in a strange new land. I cherished the moments that I spent with my parents for I knew that they would be the ones I'd miss the most. I certainly wasn't wrong about that.

But in a world of change, Jesus was the constant and the comfort. The church was a familiar place. The same Spirit that dwelt in my Christian brothers and sisters in Hyderabad dwells within my church family in Wayne. I am an international, but I am not a foreigner at Church of the Saviour. I am part of the family. It is my prayer that other international students would share my experience as they experience what it's like to be loved by God through the love of His family at COS."

Thomas asked a couple of his international student friends what they missed most about their home country. They said:

"I miss my family and friends. There were so many memories we shared. I miss waking up to the smell of my mother's cooking and the sound of the famous Lebanese singer Fairoz. There are many things that I miss about my hometown but thankfully I was able to find a little place I can call home here and a group of amazing friends that are family."

"I miss Chinese food for sure! I miss the extremely convenient and cheap means of public transportation in Shanghai. I especially miss using my native language to freely and effortlessly express myself. Whereas I struggle to do the same with English and it sometimes stresses me out. I feel like everything is under control in Shanghai – I can handle anything, I can go anywhere and do what I want."
