GETTING TO KNOW JESUS

OBJECTIVE:

To introduce the class to Jesus Christ. To instill in class members the desire to want to have a personal or more personal relationship with the Lord. To help them see that once they really know Jesus for themselves, that He is the best thing that could have ever happened in their life. To confirm through biblical evidence that Christ is deity — God in human form.

MEMORY VERSE:

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth (John 1:1, 14).

Jesus Christ is the subject of more than 300 Old Testament prophecies. His birth nearly 2,000 years ago and events of His life have been foretold by many individual prophets over a period of 1,500 years. History confirms beyond a doubt that Jesus Christ is the true Messiah, the Son of God, and the Savior of the world.
