TODAY: SEPTEMBER 12-13

Bible Story: Joseph and His Brothers *Genesis 37*

Big Idea: God Never Changes

Focus: God can always be trusted

Memory Verse: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."
Hebrews 13:8 (NirV)

Bible Story Summary:

Read *Genesis 37, Psalm 145:13, Isaiah 26:4, Deuteronomy 7:9, Proverbs 21:1.*

Joseph was his father's favorite son out of twelve brothers. His brothers hated him. One day, they schemed to throw him into a pit and tell their father he was dead. They sold Joseph to a caravan of traders, and he was taken to Egypt. Joseph encountered more terrible situations, but God was using every single event for good. Eventually, God would use Joseph's circumstances to place him in a position of power in Egypt, where he would save many lives.

He Question: Why can God be trusted?

Because He is completely good, everything God does is right and good. He is completely faithful.

We Question: Can we trust God when things don't go our way?

Bad things happen because we live in a broken world. We can trust that God has a plan and He is good.

Me Question: How is God inviting me to respond?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.

Drive Time



Before you leave your house, pick a destination and ask your child if they know how to get there. They may say yes or they may just tell you to put it in the GPS. Share with your child that God is like the GPS for our life. Like God, a GPS knows exactly how to get from one place to another giving you step by step instructions so you don't get lost or miss a turn. DAY 1

READ *Hebrews 13:8 (NirV)*

You are working to memorize this verse all month long. With the help of a parent, write the verse out on a piece of paper. Begin by saying the verse a few times. Then grab a black crayon or marker and color over a word so you can't see it. See if you can say the verse without that word. Continue coloring over a word until the whole verse is colored over. Can you still say it? Hopefully this helps you to hide God's word in your heart so you can remember that He can always be trusted!

DAY 2

READ *Psalm 145:13 (NirV)*

Think about your toys. The batteries to your toy will run out at some point. Your toy might break, or you may get bored and eventually find different toys to play with. When it comes to God's love, it does not break or stop. He is the same God yesterday, today and tomorrow! We live in a world that is constantly changing and you may go through some tough times, but God will never fail. You can always trust Him.

With the help of a parent, correct the verse.

Your kingdom is a kingdom that will last a short time. Your rule will continue for some time to come. The Lord will not keep all his promises. He is not faithful in everything He does.

DAY 3

READ Psalm 121:8 (NIRV)

What is something that you put on your feet when you are coming and going? Your shoes! When you go outside to play, you put your shoes on. When you go to school or the park, you put your shoes on. Everywhere your feet take you, God is already there! He never looks away and is always there watching over you. Joseph went through so many hard times but not once did he face it alone. Just like God was with Joseph, He is with you and has a plan.

With the help of a parent, decorate the shoe to help you remember God is with you wherever you go and you can trust Him and His plan.
