Setting the Tone for the Experience

What You Say:

OPENER

HOST: "Hey, everyone! Welcome to [Name of Environment]! I'm so glad you're here today. If this is your first time, welcome! I hope you're ready, because today is kind of a big deal.

"Who here knows what just started?"

(Pause for responses.)

"That's right, summer! Summer means no school alarms, longer days, more time outside, camps, vacations, popsicles, and maybe even staying up later than you're supposed to.

"And this summer, we're starting something brand new together. This summer, we're going on a Kingdom Quest! The full name of our summer series is 'Kingdom Quest—Seeking the Greatest Treasure.'

"You don't need a backpack, a map, or a pirate ship for this quest. But what you do need to know is this: Jesus told stories that help us understand something called God's kingdom—what it's like, how it works, and how we get to be part of it.

"And this month, we're going to be unpacking some of those stories together.







"But right now, it's time to kick things off with a game because summer plus games equals a great start!

- Make a start line with floor tape in the game area.
- Place four tissue boxes on the start line, and set one bucket a few feet away directly across from each tissue box.
- Practice throwing a few tissues in the buckets as you're setting up to know how far away the buckets should be from the start line—a few feet away is suggested.

What You Say:

Today's game is called 'Tissue Toss!'

SLIDE: Tissue Toss! Title

"I need four kids who want to play. Raise your hand if you'd like to volunteer!"

(Pick four volunteers from the kids who have their hands raised and invite them to the game area. Line them up side by side at the start line behind the boxes of tissues.)

"Let's hear it for our players! Here's how our game works: Each of you has a box of tissues. In just a second, your job will be to toss tissues, one at a time, into your bucket.

"The buckets are a few feet away. Not super close but not super far. Just far enough to make this interesting.

"So remember, you can only throw one tissue at a time. And no crumpling the tissue! You'll have one minute to toss as many tissues into your bucket as you can.

"Audience, your job is to cheer them on!"

"Alright, players, are you ready? Audience, are you ready? On your mark ... get set ...GO!"

AUDIO: Upbeat music

Optional Video: 1-Minute Countdown

(Play the game. Start the timer—or smartphone or watch or countdown. Encourage the players and involve the audience.)

"Whoa, that one floated forever! Keep going! You've got this!

(Play until the one-minute timer is up.)

"And TIME! Freeze!

"Alright, let's see how everyone did!

(Count the tissues in each kid's bucket.)

"And our winner today is ... [Winner's Name]!

"Let's give it up for all of our players! Great job, everyone! You guys can take your seats.

(If time allows, continue with more rounds. Ask for four new volunteers at the start of each round. Make sure to empty the tissues out of each bucket at the start of each round.)

"Alright, that was fun! We'll be having lots of fun all summer!

"We're going to unpack some pretty cool stories today, and our Bottom Line will help kick things off. Let's check it out!

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Jesus shows us God's kingdom. Can you say that with me?"

KIDS AND HOST: **[Bottom Line]** "Jesus shows us God's kingdom."

HOST: "Great job, friends! Thanks for playing our game with me today. Now let's get ready to dive into God's Word, the Bible!"

What You Say:

Before we move on, I want to teach you a prayer that Jesus taught the people who followed Him. This prayer helps us understand how to talk to God and what really matters to Him.

"We'll be learning this prayer together all month as part of our Kingdom Quest because it reminds us that God is our King, and we want His ways to shape our world.

"Let's take a look at this prayer! It's our Memory Verse for this month, and it's found in Matthew 6:10. I'll read it first, and then I will lead you through it.

SLIDE: Memory Verse

WORSHIP LEADER: "May your kingdom come. May what you want to happen be done on earth as it is done in heaven." —Matthew 6:10 NIV"

"Now, I'll lead you through each part. Repeat after me, nice and loud!"

WORSHIP LEADER: "May your kingdom come."

What You Say:

BIBLE STORY (STORYTELLER SCRIPT)

SLIDE: Theme Background

(Things to have ready: Set up the table at the front of the teaching area so the Storyteller can place their Bible on it and read from it. Single popcorn kernel and bowl of popped popcorn on the table. Filled clear pitcher of water, plastic stirring spoon, scissors, packet of Kool-Aid, and package of baby wipes on the table.)

INTRODUCTION

STORYTELLER: "Hello, everyone! I'm so glad you're here today! It's summer! WOOHOO! And we're starting a new theme. It's 'Kingdom Quest—Seeking the Greatest Treasure'!

"All summer long, we're going to learn about God's kingdom. God's kingdom is where He reigns as King! God is loving, joyful, kind, just, and good—among other things. And God's kingdom is where His love, joy, kindness, justice, and goodness are the way things operate. All summer long, we're going to be learning about God's kingdom. But more than that, as we learn about God's kingdom, we are going to learn about its King!

"To get us started, let's do something fun. I'm going to say a word, then you all act out the word I say. Ready?

"When I say 'SMALL,' make yourself as tiny as you can, like this!

(Demonstrate by crouching on the ground.)

"Let's practice. SMALL!

(Kids crouch.)

"Nice! Now when I say 'BIG,' stretch as tall as you can, like this!

(Demonstrate by standing on your toes and stretching your arms above your head.)

"Let's try it. BIG!

(Kids stretch.)

"Alright ... let's go a little faster.

"SMALL!

(Kids crouch.)

"BIG!

(Kids stretch.)

"SMALL!

(Kids crouch.)

"BIG!

(Kids stretch.)

"Okay, stay standing for a second.

"Now I'm going to say something, and you tell me if it's SMALL or BIG.

"A whisper.

(Kids respond.)

"A shout.

(Kids respond.)

"A raindrop.

(Kids respond.)

"A thunderstorm.

(Kids respond.)

"Great answers. You guys are good at this!

"Today, we're going to learn about a couple of stories Jesus told about God's kingdom starting small and ending up very big. So keep your ears open. You can take your seats!"

SETTING UP THE STORY

STORYTELLER: "Before we listen to the stories Jesus told, there's something important to know about the way He taught. Jesus told stories called 'parables.' Can you say that with me?"

STORYTELLER AND KIDS: "Parables!"

STORYTELLER: "Nice! When Jesus told a parable, it usually sounded simple at first. Nothing fancy. Just everyday life. But people knew there was something more inside the story, so they listened closely.

"When Jesus began to speak, people would stop what they were doing. They'd sit down, lean in, and pay attention. They didn't want to miss a word.

"And Jesus used things people saw all the time in His parables—things from their daily lives. Seeds planted in fields. Plants growing tall. Flour being mixed. Dough rising. Things from homes, kitchens, and towns.

"Today, we're going to hear two short parables Jesus told.

"They don't start with action. They don't sound dramatic. But Jesus chose them on purpose. Let's dive in."

the mustard seed

STORYTELLER: "One day, Jesus was teaching beside the Sea of Galilee. A huge crowd had gathered, so many people that Jesus stepped into a boat. The crowd stood along the shore, listening closely, waiting to hear what He would say next.

"Then Jesus told a story about something incredibly small.

(Open the Bible and read Matthew 13:31-32 NIV.)

Jesus told the crowd another story. He said, "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed. Someone took the seed and planted it in a field. It is the smallest of all seeds. But when it grows, it is the largest of all garden plants. It becomes a tree. Birds come and rest in its branches."

(Hold up the single popcorn kernel and walk around to show the kids.)

"Look at this. It's one tiny popcorn kernel. You barely notice it. It doesn't look powerful, does it? It doesn't look special. On its own, it's small and can't do much.

"Most people wouldn't pay attention to something this small.

"But something happens when a powerful force works on that tiny kernel. Add a little heat in a microwave, or put it in a pot with some hot oil, and ...

(Hold up one popped piece of popcorn and walk around to show the kids.)

"Suddenly, it's not the same anymore. That same kernel looks completely different! It changed! It grew! It became something completely different from what it started as.

"And Jesus said that the mustard seed works the same way. Once it's planted, it doesn't stay tiny. It grows. And grows. And grows ... until it becomes a tree big enough for birds to land on and rest in.

"Something small becomes something surprising.

(Hold up the big bowl full of popped popcorn and walk around to show the kids.)

"Think about this. All of this came from tiny, ordinary kernels. That's exactly the picture Jesus wanted the crowd to imagine.

"Jesus told this story to help the crowd picture the kingdom of God. The kingdom of God was growing in a beautiful way!"

the yeast

"Right after Jesus told the story of the mustard seed, He shared another one.

(Open the Bible and read Matthew 13:33 NIV.)

Jesus told them still another story. "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast," he said. "A woman mixed it into 60 pounds of flour. The yeast worked its way all through the dough."

"Now, people listening to Jesus would've understood this right away. Yeast is *tiny*. You can barely see it. But once you mix it into dough ... something starts happening. The yeast spreads and spreads and spreads throughout the dough and makes it rise. And once you bake the dough, you get nice, yummy bread!

(Hold up the clear pitcher of water, and the packet of Kool-Aid.)

"Look at this pitcher of water and packet of Kool-Aid.

(Open up the packet of Kool-Aid, pour a little powder in your hands, and push some of the powder around in your hand.)

"This packet is made up of little granules—they're kind of like yeast, super tiny, super easy to miss. But look what happens when they're poured into this pitcher of water."

(Pour the packet of Kool-Aid into the pitcher of water and stir it around with the plastic spoon. Put the contents of powder on your hand in the pitcher too. Feel free to use the baby wipes to clean your hands.)

"It completely fills the pitcher and changes the color! Every molecule of water was affected by the Kool-Aid, just like yeast totally spreads and gets into every bit of dough!

"Jesus said the kingdom of heaven is like yeast, something small and hidden that grows and grows and fills everything around it.

"As the yeast spreads through the dough, it changes the whole thing. That's exactly the picture Jesus wanted the crowd to imagine. God's kingdom is always growing. And it changes everything."

wrapping up THE STORY

STORYTELLER: "Jesus didn't tell these two stories just to talk about seeds and yeast. He told them because He wanted people to understand something bigger—what God's kingdom is really like.

"In the first story, something tiny grows into something large enough to give shelter.

"In the second story, something little like yeast spreads until it fills everything around it.

"Both stories start small. Both stories end in a way no one expected.

"That's the way Jesus described God's kingdom.

"It might not look impressive at first. It might seem easy to miss. It might even feel quiet or slow. But once it begins, once God is at work, His kingdom grows. And it keeps growing. It keeps spreading. It keeps changing things. Just the fact that I'm talking to you today about the kingdom of God shows that it keeps growing. Someone heard about Jesus and decided to follow Him, then someone heard about Jesus and decided to follow Him, and then someone heard about Jesus and decided to follow Him, and on and on, until here we are, talking about Jesus! His kingdom keeps growing!

"And that's the way God wants it! God wants His kingdom to grow and grow and grow! He wants more and more people to accept Jesus' payment for their sins and follow Him as King.

"Jesus is God, and He came from where God lives, and while He was on earth, He came and taught us about things of God. He came and taught us about God's kingdom.

"In fact, that's what our Bottom Line is all about today. Let's see what it says.

[Bottom Line] "Jesus shows us God's kingdom. Can you say that with me?"

What You Say:

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

"As you can see, God's kingdom started really, really small, and it's growing! It grows and grows as more people begin to follow Jesus and start their forever friendship with Him. And as a follower of Jesus, you are a part of this kingdom!

"As a follower of Jesus, the King, you are a part of God's kingdom, but you don't have to grow it. That's God's job. But you can point to it! When you're kind to someone lonely, you're pointing to Jesus and saying, 'Hey, the King of this kingdom is kind like this!' When you forgive someone for breaking your game controller, you're pointing to Jesus and saying, 'Hey, the King of this kingdom is forgiving, like this.'

"And maybe they'll ask why you're different. And you can tell them that Jesus, the King, loves them too and wants to be their forever friend! You can point to Jesus, the King!

"Ask the Holy Spirit to help you become more like Jesus so you can live out the kingdom. God Himself lives inside of you through His Spirit, the Holy Spirit, and He loves to help you. The Holy Spirit can work through you so you can point to Jesus by living out the ways of His kingdom wherever you are—in your home, your neighborhood, your school, and your city.

"Jesus came to teach us about God and God's kingdom. And as we follow Him, we also have our mission. We are to point to Jesus in the way we live, so the darkness of this world is pushed back by Jesus' light. That is our Kingdom Quest!

"Let's take a quiet moment and talk to the King of the kingdom, friends.

- *Make sure your church has obtained licensing rights to play or perform music. You can obtain a license to perform worship music from Christian Copyright Licensing International (www.ccli.com). It covers over 200,000 worship songs for congregational singing. You are responsible for including the copyright information on all songs reproduced under the Church Copyright License (including song lyrics projected onscreen). This includes the song title, writer credit(s), copyright notice, and your church's CCLI license number. You can include this information on one of the lyric slides, or you can create a separate slide detailing this information, but the copyright information must appear at least once for each song you play or perform. For example:*

*"Hallelujah" words and music by John Doe
©2000 Good Music Co.
CCLI License # 0000*
