Setting the Tone for the Experience

What You Say:

OPENER

HOST: "Hey, everyone! Welcome back to Kingdom Quest! I'm so glad you're here today. This room is full of energy, and I can tell it's going to be an awesome morning. If today is your first time, we're so happy you're here!"

"This whole summer, we've been going on a Kingdom Quest and discovering more about what it means to live in God's kingdom. The full name of our series this month is 'Kingdom Quest—Living the Greatest Adventure.'

"But what is God's kingdom? Well, God's kingdom is anywhere where He reigns! He is loving, joyful, kind, trustworthy, holy, and righteous—and all of these really great things. God's kingdom is good because the King is good. And we want God to spread this good kingdom everywhere because it is so good!"

"Before we jump into our game, let's warm up. Everyone, stand up!"

"If you're excited to be here, wiggle your fingers.

(Pause while kids wiggle their fingers.)

"If you're really excited, wiggle your toes.

(Pause while kids wiggle their toes.)

"If you're really, really, really excited, wiggle your ears.

(Pause while kids wiggle their ears.)

"And if you're super excited ... give me your biggest, goofiest, wiggliest wave!"

(Pause while kids wave.)

"Nice! You all look ready.

"Go ahead and take a seat. It's officially game time! Today's game is called ... 'Dodge the Drop!'"

SLIDE: Dodge the Drop! Title

"I need some volunteers who want to play 'Dodge the Drop!' Raise your hand to volunteer!

(Choose 10 kids from the ones who have their hands raised, and line them up behind the pool noodle "bridge" in a single file line.)

"Awesome! Come line up right here. Now, we have two leaders holding pool noodles to make a bridge. Your job is to run under that bridge... but watch out! If the bridge drops while you're under it, you're out! If the bridge drops on you, you get to join the cheering section! If not, get back in line, and go again!

"The leaders can drop the bridge at any moment, so keep your eyes open and your feet fast.

"Everyone else, pick your favorite runner and cheer them on! Sound good?

"Alright, racers ... are you ready? On your mark ... get set ... GO!

AUDIO: Upbeat music

(Play the game.)

"Whoa! That was fast! Nice dodge! Keep running!

(Play the game until one runner remains. Declare the winner.)

"And we have a winner! Great job, runners, and great cheering from the rest of you!

(Continue with more rounds as time allows. Ask for 10 new volunteers at the start of each round.)

"Now that we're warmed up, let's check out our Bottom Line.

[Bottom Line] "God's kingdom grows when you pray and don't give up. Can you say that with me?"

KIDS AND HOST: [Bottom Line] "God's kingdom grows when you pray and don't give up."

HOST: "Great job, friends! We're going to learn more about that very soon!"

What You Say:

AMAZING MUSIC

WORSHIP LEADER: "Hey, everyone! I'm so excited to worship with you all today! Worship is when we use our voices, our bodies, and our hearts to tell God how much we love Him.

"Sometimes worship looks like singing loudly. Sometimes it looks like singing quietly. Sometimes it looks like lifting your hands or clapping or just standing still. But worship is always about one thing—giving our love and attention to God.

"God loves it when we sing to Him. He loves it when we celebrate who He is. And He loves it when we choose to spend time with Him ... even when life feels hard, or slow, or we're waiting for something. Worship helps our hearts stay close to God.

"Let's stand up together and sing with all our hearts!

SONG: "Closer" Dance Motion, Lyric or Instrumental Lyric Videos are available with Amazing Music on APlay

"Let's keep worshipping! Our next song, 'King Of My Heart,' is a way to tell God, 'You are good, and I trust You.' If there's something you feel worried about or something you've been praying about, you can tell God during this song. He hears you every time you talk to Him.

What You Say:

SONG: "King Of My Heart" Dance Motion, Lyric or Instrumental Lyric Videos are available with Amazing Music on APlay

"Remember this: God loves spending time with you. When you sing to Him, when you talk to Him, and even when you just think about Him, He's happy. God is always close, and He loves it when you worship Him with your whole heart.

"Now it's time to go over our Memory Verse we've been learning all month! This verse helps us remember what God's kingdom is like. God's kingdom is good and full of good things because He is good!

"Our Memory Verse is found in Romans 14:17. I'll read it first, then I'll guide you through it!

SLIDE: Memory Verse

"Now, let me guide you through it. Repeat after me—nice and loud!

What You Say:**BIBLE STORY (STORYTELLER SCRIPT)***SLIDE: Theme Background**(Things to have ready: Set up the table at the front of the teaching area so the Storyteller can place their Bible on it and read from it. Judge's table and chair set up at the front of the teaching area with the stacks of paper and stamp prop on the table. Shawl prop in the teaching area.)***INTRODUCTION**

STORYTELLER: "Hi, friends! Welcome back to Kingdom Quest! I'm so glad you're all here today. All summer long, we've been talking about God's kingdom. Our theme this month is: 'Kingdom Quest—Living the Greatest Adventure.'

"But what is God's kingdom? Well, God's kingdom is where He is King! It's where He reigns, and where His ways—His love, His faithfulness, His truthfulness, and His goodness—are the way things operate. God's kingdom is a good, good place that we want everyone to be a part of! We want more people to see how awesome God, the King, is and join His kingdom!

"To get us started as we dive into our Bible Story about God's kingdom, I want to talk about something we've all felt before.

"Have you ever tried to do something that was really hard? Maybe you were trying to tie your shoes ... or build a tall block tower ... or learn to ride a bike ... or open a snack that just WOULD. NOT. OPEN.

"Ugh! Sometimes things are tough, right? And sometimes ... we feel like giving up.

"Let me see your 'I want to give up' face.

(Pause while kids make faces.)

"Yep. I know that face. I've made that face too!

"But have you ever kept trying anyway? Even when it was hard? Maybe you tried again ... and again ... and AGAIN ... until you finally got it.

"Turn to someone next to you, and tell them one thing you kept trying until you finally did it.

(Pause while kids talk to each other.)

"I love that! Trying something again and again shows how strong and brave you are.

"In today's Bible Story, Jesus tells us about someone who didn't give up. She kept going and going because she knew what she needed. And Jesus wants us to learn something really important from her.

"Let's get ready to hear the story!"

SETTING UP THE STORY

STORYTELLER: "Jesus told many parables, also known as stories. This one was about a widow. A widow is a woman whose husband has died. Back during the time when Jesus lived, that made life very, very hard. Widows didn't have many ways to earn money or get help. So if something unfair happened to them, they had no one to speak up for them. In Jesus' story, this widow had a big problem. Someone was treating her badly, and she needed someone to help make it right.

"In her town, there was a judge. A judge was supposed to listen to people's problems and help make good and fair decisions. Today, they often sit behind big desks.

"So the widow decided to go to the judge. She hoped he would listen and help her. But things didn't go the way she expected.

"Would the judge help her? Would the widow give up? Or would she keep trying?"

the widow keeps asking

STORYTELLER: "Now let's hear the story Jesus told. For this part, I need one volunteer to play the widow and another one to sit at the judge's table to be the judge. Raise your hand if you'd like to volunteer!"

(Choose two volunteers from the kids who have their hands raised, and invite them to the front of the teaching area. Give the shawl to the widow to put on.)

(Have the widow stay standing, and have the judge go sit behind the judge's table.)

"Great! Our widow is going to have one job. She's going to say this line every time she comes up to the judge's table: 'Please make things right!' Let's practice that.

(Have the volunteer playing the widow say: "Please make things right!")

"Perfect! Now, judge, every time the widow comes up to your table and says her line, you either pretend you don't hear her or shoo her away. Sound good? Volunteers ready?"

"Perfect! Now let's hear how Jesus began the story.

(Open the Bible and read Luke 18:2-3 NIV.)

He said, "In a certain town there was a judge. He didn't have any respect for God or care about what people thought. A widow lived in that town. She came to the judge again and again. She kept begging him, 'Make things right for me. Someone is treating me badly.'"

"Let's see what that looked like. Widow, go stand in front of the judge's table, and say your line."

(Widow goes to the judge's table.)

WIDOW: "Please make things right!"

(Judge ignores her or waves her away.)

STORYTELLER: "The judge didn't want to help. He didn't listen. He didn't care. But the widow didn't stop. Widow, go back to the judge's table, and say your line."

(Widow goes back to the judge's table.)

WIDOW: "Please make things right!"

(Judge ignores her or waves her away.)

STORYTELLER: "Still no help. Still no answer. But Jesus said the widow kept going."

"Widow, go back to the judge's table, and say your line."

(Widow goes back to the judge's table.)

WIDOW: "Please make things right!"

STORYTELLER: "The widow went to the judge over and over again. She didn't give up. She knew she needed help, so she kept asking."

THE JUDGE FINALLY HELPS

STORYTELLER: "Jesus continued the story. Even though the widow kept coming, the judge still didn't want to help her."

(Open the Bible and read Luke 18:4a NIV.)

"For some time the judge refused."

"Widow, go back to the judge's table, and say your line."

(Widow goes back to the judge's table.)

WIDOW: "Please make things right!"

(Judge ignores her or waves her away.)

STORYTELLER: "The judge still didn't want to help. He didn't respect God. He didn't care about people. And he definitely didn't want to be bothered.

"Widow, go back to the judge's table, and say your line."

(Widow goes back to the judge's table.)

WIDOW: "Please make things right!"

(Judge ignores her or waves her away.)

STORYTELLER: "But even though the judge wasn't kind or caring, Jesus told His friends something surprising about the judge.

(Open your Bible and read Luke 18:4b-5 NIV.)

"But finally he said to himself, 'I don't have any respect for God. I don't care about what people think. But this widow keeps bothering me. So I will see that things are made right for her. If I don't, she will someday come and attack me!'"

"Okay, judge, now tell the widow, 'Fine! I'll make things right!'"

JUDGE: "Fine! I'll make things right!"

STORYTELLER: "Okay, judge, stamp one of the papers on your table, and hand it to the widow.

(Judge stamps a paper loudly and hands it to the widow.)

"Okay, widow, now celebrate and get excited!"

(Widow celebrates.)

"Even though the judge didn't care, he finally helped the widow because she kept coming back. She didn't stop asking. She didn't give up.

"Wow, thank you so much, volunteers! You can all take a seat!"

GOD IS NOT LIKE THE JUDGE

STORYTELLER: "Jesus wasn't finished with His story. After He told His friends about the judge and the widow, He explained what the story meant.

(Open the Bible and read Luke 18:6-7 NIV.)

The Lord said, "Listen to what the unfair judge says. God's chosen people cry out to him day and night. Won't he make things right for them? Will he keep putting them off?"

"Jesus wanted everyone to understand something very important. The judge in the story didn't care about people. He didn't want to help. He only helped the widow because he was tired of being bothered.

"BUT ... God is not like that judge.

"God cares about you. God listens to you. God loves hearing your prayers—every single one.

(Open the Bible and read Luke 18:8a NIV.)

"I tell you, God will see that things are made right for them. He will make sure it happens quickly. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find people on earth who have faith?"

"Jesus was saying, 'If even a judge who doesn't care will finally help ... just imagine how much MORE God will help—because God loves you.'

"The widow kept asking. She didn't give up. And Jesus told this story so we would remember to keep asking God and asking God and asking God—just like the widow.

"Sometimes we pray for something, and we don't get an answer right away. Sometimes we have to wait. Sometimes we have to ask again and again. But God always hears you. And He never gets tired of listening.

"In God's kingdom, we keep praying, and we don't give up."

WRAPPING UP THE STORY

STORYTELLER: "Jesus' story had two very different people in it. There was a widow who needed help, and she kept going to the judge again and again. She didn't stop asking, even when the judge ignored her.

"The judge didn't care about helping her. He didn't listen. He didn't pay attention. But the widow kept coming back. And finally, the judge decided to help her. He made things right for her because she never gave up.

"Jesus wanted His friends to hear how the widow kept trying, even when things were hard. And He wanted them to notice that the judge eventually listened, even though he wasn't kind or caring.

"In Jesus' story, something changed because the widow didn't quit. And if an unfair judge helped her, think about how much more God will help us and answer our prayers.

"God wants us to talk to Him and talk to Him and talk to Him about what we want and need. And He promises that He will do great kingdom things when we do!

"That reminds me of our Bottom Line for today. Let's see what it says.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "God's kingdom grows when you pray and don't give up. Can you say that with me?"

(Host enters and joins in.)

KIDS, STORYTELLER, AND HOST: [Bottom Line] "God's kingdom grows when you pray and don't give up."

What You Say:

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

HOST: "God loves it when we talk to Him. He loves hearing your voice. He loves when you tell Him what you need, what you're worried about, what you're hoping for, and what you're thankful for. And just like the widow didn't give up, God wants us to keep praying too."

"Sometimes we pray about something one time, and it takes a while before anything changes. But God does answer prayer. Sometimes God says, 'Yes.' Sometimes He says, 'No.' And a lot of times, God says, 'Not yet.' But no matter what, Jesus gives us permission to keep on asking for what we want."

"We should start praying over and over again. God never gets tired of you. He never says, 'Go away.' He never ignores you."

"When you keep praying—when you keep talking to God, and talking to God, and talking to God—it helps your heart stay close to God. And even when things are slow or hard, God is working. He is listening."

"So this week, think about something you want to talk to God about. Maybe someone you love is sick. Maybe you're scared of something. Maybe you want to be brave. Maybe you want help with a friendship. Whatever it is, keep praying and praying and praying, and don't give up."

"Let's talk to the God who wants to hear from you!"

What You Say:

PRAYER

STORYTELLER OR HOST: "You can bow your heads and close your eyes."

"God, thank You for loving us so much. Thank You that You always listen when we pray. Sometimes we have things that feel hard, or things we're waiting for, and it can be easy to want to give up. But we want to keep praying and asking, just like the widow in the story. Help us remember that You hear us every single time. Help us trust You, even when we have to wait. God, we want Your kingdom to grow. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

(Dismiss kids to Small Groups.)

AUDIO: Play calm music as the kids exit.
