



**But God... - pt 1**

**“Author of Life Author of Hope”**

**( Acts 3:15 )**

**Sunday, March 22, 2026**

**5-Day Devotional: But God - The Author of Life and Hope**

**Day 1: The Author Who Creates From Nothing**

**Reading:** John 1:1-5; Colossians 1:15-17

**Devotional:** Before anything existed, Jesus was there—speaking creation into being. The same voice that formed galaxies and breathed life into humanity is the voice that speaks over your life today. When you face circumstances that feel impossible, remember that God specializes in creating something from nothing. Your dead dreams, broken relationships, and hopeless situations are not beyond His creative power. He didn't just author the beginning of creation; He continues writing your story even now. The pen is still in His hand. Whatever feels empty or void in your life today, invite the Author of Life to speak into that space. He hasn't lost His creative touch.

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**Day 2: When Life Takes the Life Out of You**

**Reading:** Psalm 42:1-11; Romans 8:11

**Devotional:** "Why am I discouraged? Why is my heart so sad?" The psalmist doesn't answer his own question—he simply redirects his focus to God. Sometimes life drains us: work overwhelms, relationships disappoint, and the world's chaos steals our peace. But the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead lives in you. This isn't wishful thinking; it's confident hope based on proven power. You don't need to manufacture joy or pretend everything is fine. Instead, acknowledge your weariness and then declare, "I will put my hope in God." The resurrection power within you can revive what feels dead. Give Him your exhausted heart today, and watch Him breathe new life into your weary soul.

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### Day 3: You Killed the Author of Life, But God...

**Reading:** Acts 3:11-26; 1 Peter 1:3-9

**Devotional:** Peter's words cut deep: "You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead." Even those who rejected Jesus weren't beyond hope's reach. This is the beauty of "but God"—it changes everything. Your past failures, your worst decisions, your deepest regrets—none of these write your final chapter. Death couldn't hold Jesus, and your mistakes can't hold you captive either. The resurrection declares that failure is not your final word, sin doesn't get the last say, and death is not the end of your story. Whatever you've done or whatever's been done to you, "but God" stands as your declaration of hope. He specializes in resurrection moments. What needs a "but God" intervention in your life today?

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### Day 4: Surrendering the Pen

**Reading:** Proverbs 3:5-6; Jeremiah 29:11

**Devotional:** We desperately try to control our stories—rewriting our identity, forcing outcomes, manipulating every variable. We act like skilled authors, but we're actually terrible editors of our own lives. True surrender isn't losing control; it's returning the story to the One who already knows the ending. God isn't asking you to give up; He's inviting you to give over. Stop trying to be the author of your own life. You weren't designed to carry that pen. When you surrender control to God, you're not admitting defeat—you're acknowledging that the Author of Life writes better stories than you ever could. What are you trying to control today? Lay down the pen. Trust the Author who has never written a bad ending.

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### Day 5: Hope That Gets Up

**Reading:** 1 Corinthians 15:12-22; 2 Corinthians 4:16-18

**Devotional:** Because Jesus got up, hope got up with Him. The resurrection isn't just historical fact; it's your present reality. Hope isn't wishful thinking with crossed fingers—it's confidence in God's ability to finish what He started. You may be stuck on a painful page, reading the same heartbreak over and over. You may think your story has gone too far off the rails. But the Author isn't finished writing. The difficult chapter you're in doesn't determine how your story ends. Jesus conquered what you couldn't conquer. He overcame what you couldn't overcome. And He lives in you, working resurrection power in your everyday moments. Spend time with Him today—know His voice, recognize His hands. Hope is always available because He never leaves you.

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**Reflection Questions for the Week:**

Where have you been trying to write your own story instead of trusting God?

What "dead" area of your life needs resurrection power?

How can you share your story to encourage someone else this week?
