### 5-Day Devotional: Willing to Be Changed

#### Day 1: The Water Becomes Wine

**Reading:** John 2:1-11

**Devotional:** Jesus doesn't need you to change yourself—He just needs you to be willing to change. At the wedding in Cana, the water didn't transform itself; it simply remained available for Jesus to work His miracle. The servants didn't understand the process, but they obeyed anyway. Today, stop trying to fix yourself before coming to Christ. You cannot manufacture the wine of transformation on your own. Like water in those stone jars, you may feel ordinary, inadequate, or empty. But when you make yourself available to Jesus and simply say, "Here I am—do what You need to do," He can turn your ordinary into extraordinary. Surrender precedes transformation. Are you willing?

#### Day 2: Passion for God's House

**Reading:** Psalm 69:1-18; John 2:13-17

**Devotional:** Jesus' cleansing of the temple reveals something profound: conversion comes before cleansing. First, Jesus changes who we are; then He corrects what's in our lives. When Jesus drove out the money changers, He wasn't reacting in anger but responding in righteousness. He took time to fashion a whip—His correction was thoughtful, not impulsive. What "clutter" has accumulated in your life that prevents you from fulfilling your worshipful purpose? Jesus desires to clear out distractions, false priorities, and anything that turns your heart into a marketplace rather than a sanctuary. His cleansing may be uncomfortable, but it's always purposeful. Let Him remove what doesn't belong so you can worship freely.

### Day 3: Deep Connection Over Fandom

**Reading:** John 2:23-25; James 2:14-26

**Devotional:** Many followed Jesus because He was impressive, charismatic, and powerful—but Jesus didn't trust their shallow commitment. He distinguished between fans and true followers. Today's culture has confused "following" with passive scrolling through someone's life. But Jesus isn't looking for followers who mindlessly include Him in their routine. He seeks those who desire deep connection and real change. Are you a fan of Jesus or a follower of Jesus? Fans admire from a distance; followers walk closely and allow His presence to transform everything. Jesus knew human nature then, and He knows yours now. He's not impressed by your attendance or religious activity—He wants your whole heart, fully surrendered and deeply connected to Him.

### Day 4: God Is Still the Same

**Reading:** Hebrews 13:8; Malachi 3:6

**Devotional:** In a world of constant change and instability, we have an anchor: God never changes. The same God who turned water into wine, who calmed storms, who raised the dead—that God is available to you today. When did He break His promise? Never. When did His kindness fail? Never. When did He lose His power? Never. Not once has He stopped moving, stopped proving, or let go of His children. Your circumstances may shift like waves, but God remains your stable foundation. Whatever you're facing today, remember: the God of yesterday's miracles is the God of today's impossibilities. His faithfulness isn't just historical—it's present and personal. Trust Him again today.

### Day 5: Honoring God with Everything

**Reading:** 1 Corinthians 6:19-20; Romans 12:1-2

**Devotional:** God bought you with a high price—the life of His Son. This wasn't a bargain purchase or clearance-rack salvation. Jesus paid the ultimate cost so you could know Him fully. The proper response isn't just verbal praise but complete surrender of who you are and what you do. We complain about rising prices for milk, eggs, and gas, yet we forget the incomparable price Jesus paid for our freedom. How are you honoring Him with your body, your time, your resources, your relationships? Worship isn't confined to Sunday mornings—it's a lifestyle of giving Jesus everything. Stop holding back areas of your life. He deserves all of you, not just the parts you're comfortable surrendering.
