



TEN COMMANDMENTS Part 2 (6-10)

The 10 Commandments, Part 2

1. In the Sixth Commandment, God safeguards that basic institution: Marriage. What is marriage?

The Bible Says:

Genesis 2	18	The Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him."
Genesis 2	19	Now the Lord God had formed out of the ground all the wild animals and all the birds in the sky. He brought them to the man to see what he would name them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name.
Genesis 2	20	So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds in the sky and all the wild animals. But for Adam ^{Or the man} no suitable helper was found.
Genesis 2	21	So the Lord God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of the man's ribs ^{Or took part of the man's side} and then closed up the place with flesh.
Genesis 2	22	Then the Lord God made a woman from the rib[c] he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man.
Genesis 2	23	The man said, "This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman,' for she was taken out of man."
Genesis 2	24	That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh.
Matthew 19:6	04	So, they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, let no one separate."
Romans 7	04	For example, by law a married woman is bound to her husband as long as he is alive, but if her husband dies, she is released from the law that binds her to him.

From this we Learn:

(A) Marriage is God's holy institution.

(B) It is a union of one man and one woman unto one flesh.

(C) It is a life-long union.

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2.	For what purpose did God institute marriage?	
The Bible Says:		
Genesis 1	28	God blessed them and said to them, “Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground.”
Genesis 2	18	The Lord God said, “It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him.”
1 Corinthians 7	02	But since sexual immorality is occurring, each man should have sexual relations with his own wife, and each woman with her own husband.
From this we Learn: The purposes of marriage are:		
	(A) Marriage is God's holy institution.	
	(B) Mutual companionship and helpfulness; (Married people are to love and honor each other, the husband his wife as his God-given helpmate, and the wife her husband as her God-given head. Eph. 5:24-25 .)	
	(C) The prevention of immorality	

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3.	Which is the Sixth Commandment	
The Bible Says:		
	Exodus 20:14	You shall not commit adultery
(A)	Matthew 19:09	I tell you that anyone who divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another woman commits adultery.
	1 Corinthians 7:15	But if the unbeliever leaves, let it be so. The brother or the sister is not bound in such circumstances; God has called us to live in peace.
(B)	Matthew 5:28	But I tell you that anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart.
	1 Corinthians 5:04	So when you are assembled and I am with you in spirit, and the Lord Jesus is present,
	Ephesians 5:4	Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place, but rather thanksgiving.
	1 Corinthians 6:18	Flee from sexual immorality. All other sins a person commits are outside the body, but whoever sins sexually, sins against their own body.
	1 Corinthians 6:19	Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, which you have received from God? You are not your own;
	1 Corinthians 6:20	you were bought at a price. Therefore, honor God with your bodies as with holy vessels.
(C)	Timothy 5:22	Do not be hasty in the laying on of hands, and do not share in the sins of others. Keep yourself pure.
From this we Learn		
	<u>We should NOT:</u>	
	(A)	Break the marriage vow by unfaithfulness, malicious desertion, unscriptural divorce, (In the case of adultery or malicious desertion, the innocent party may divorce and marry another.)
	(B)	Defile ourselves with impure thoughts, desires, words, and deeds.
	<u>We SHOULD</u>	
		Remember that our body is God's temple and keep ourselves pure.

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4.	Which is the Seventh Commandment??	
The Bible Says:		
Exodus.20	15	You shall not steal.
From this we Learn: We Should NOT:		
	(Wrongfully acquire, or sinfully long for, our fellowman's property. [Forbidden in this Commandment is every form of dishonesty, over charging, unfair wages, idleness: also envy and selfishness.]	
	We SHOULD	
	Remember that we are only stewards, or managers, of all that we call our own, and use it to the glory of God and the welfare of our fellowman..	
1 st Peter 4	10	Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms..
	(C) The prevention of immorality	

5.	Which is the Eighth Commandment??	
The Bible Says:		
Exodus.20	16	Thou shalt not bear false witness against your neighbor. (This commandment applies to our conduct both in and out of court.).
From this we Learn:	We Should NOT:	
	(Lie, gossip, speak or even think evil of our fellowman.	
	We SHOULD	
	Defend him against false accusations, speak well of him, cover up his faults, and explain in his favor whatever can be so explained	
Eph. 4:15	15	Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ.

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6. Which are the Ninth and Tenth Commandments?

The Bible Says:

Exodus 20 17 You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male or female servant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor."

(To covet means to have a strong desire for something. Covetousness is an insatiable desire for more and more, often at the expense of others.)

From this we Learn:

(A) Marriage is God's holy institution.

(B) It is a union of one man and one woman unto one flesh.

(C) It is a life-long union.

From this we Learn:

We Should NOT:

Crave for things which are not intended for us or are forbidden to us. (Selfishness; greed; jealousy; discontent.).

We SHOULD

Find our satisfaction and happiness in God, be content with what He gives us and help our fellowman to keep that which is his.

Psalm 37	04	Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ.
Psalm 73	25	Whom have I in heaven but you? And earth has nothing I desire besides you.
Psalms 73	26	My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever
Hebrews 13	05	Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; Never will I forsake you." Deut. 31:6

7. How does Christ sum up the last seven Commandments, or the Second Table of the Law??

The Bible Says:

Matthew 22 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' { [Lev. 19:18](#)}

From this we Learn:

The last seven Commandments demand that I love my fellowman as I love myself.

Psalm 37	04	Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ.
Psalm 73	25	Whom have I in heaven but you? And earth has nothing I desire besides you.
Psalms 73	26	My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever
Hebrews 13	05	Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; Never will I forsake you." Deut. 31:6

8. This is the Law-God's holy Law. In the light of the Law, what is our standing before God?

The Bible Says:

Matthew. 5 48 Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

Romans 3 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,
Galatians 3 10 For all who rely on the works of the law are under a curse, as it is written: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the Book of the Law."[\[Deut. 27:26\]](#)

From this we Learn:

(A)	God demands that we be perfect-sinless;
(B)	But we have sinned-every one of us;.
(C)	Therefore, we are under His curse and condemnation.

The 10 Commandments, Part 2

9. Can anyone, then, be saved by the Law?

The Bible Says:

Galatians 3 10 For all who rely on the works of the law are under a curse, as it is written: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the Book of the Law."[\[Deut. 27:26\]](#)

From this we Learn:

	No one can be saved by the Law-by "being good.";
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10. What purpose does the Law serve?

The Bible Says:

Romans. 3 20 Therefore, no one will be declared righteous in God's sight by the works of the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of our sin

1 Thessalonians 4 01 As for other matters, brothers and sisters, we instructed you how to live in order to please God, as in fact you are living. Now we ask you and urge you in the Lord Jesus to do this more and more.

From this we Learn:

The Law

(A)	Shows man his sin.
(B)	Shows the Christian how to live a life pleasing to God.

11. How only are we saved?

The Bible Says:

Romans.10 04 Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

Galatians 3: 13 Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: "Cursed is everyone who is hung on a pole."[\[Deut. 21:23\]](#)

From this we Learn:

We are saved only by Christ, who

(A)	Fulfilled the Law for us; and
(B)	Redeemed us from the curse of the Law by suffering and dying in our place.

The 10 Commandments, Part 2

- Jeremiah 31 31 “The days are coming,” declares the Lord, “when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah..
- 32 It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to [Hebrew; Septuagint and Syriac / and I turned away from] them, [Or was their master]”
- declares the LORD.
- 33 “This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time,” declares the LORD. “I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.
- 34 No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, ‘Know the LORD,’ because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest,” declares the LORD. “For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more.”
