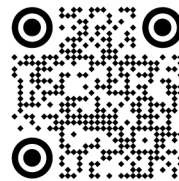

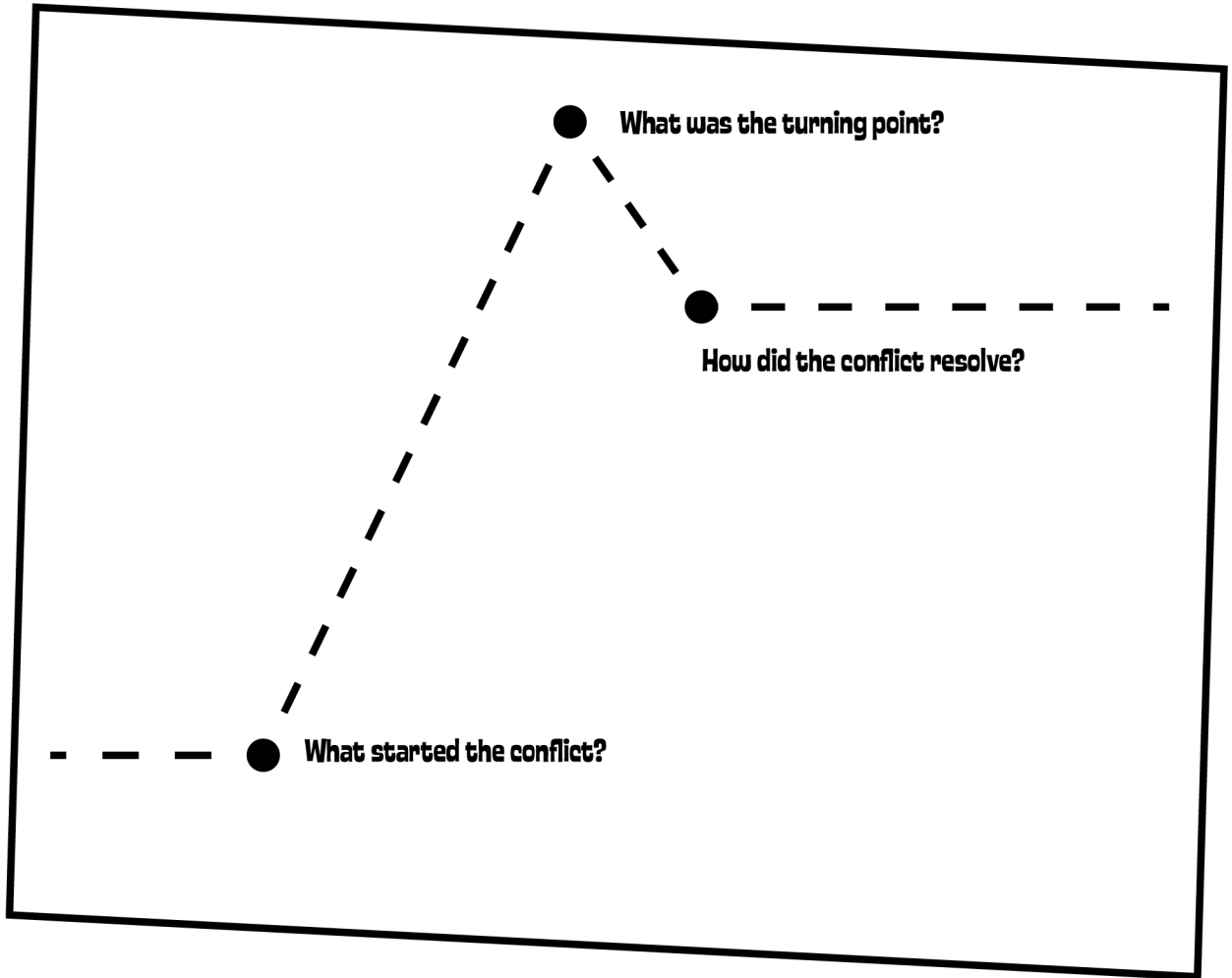
Adult/Child:
