## **Philosophy**

<u>Mission Statement</u> – Our School will use the best leadership, staff, teaching methods, schedule, and curriculum to impart to each child the character of Christ and the educational and spiritual tools needed for that child to succeed in Kindergarten and beyond.

Philosophy Statement – At IBC GO Center Preschool, it is our belief that early childhood is a critical time in the development of a child's foundational perceptions of themselves, of others, and of our Lord. We have developed a program designed to meet the needs of young children spiritually, socially and intellectually in a Christian environment.

### Philosophy Cont.

Each child is recognized as a unique individual created by God with his or her own developmental timetable. Thus, we accept each child as an individual, allowing for differences in skills and interests while encouraging well-rounded development in every facet of the child's life.

The primary source of learning for young children is through play, during which they have opportunities to explore and organize the environment around them. Play-based learning allows children to better understand themselves and their world.

Our curriculum is designed to provide hands-on experience in a variety of subject areas, since children learn most effectively through concrete materials and activities. Learning is an interactive process, therefore, we have prepared an environment in which children may learn through active exploration, interaction with adults and other children, as well as with engaging materials.

#### <u>Curriculum</u>

The IBC GO Center Preschool curriculum meets and exceeds all state standards and provides a strong foundation for a child's early years. Children learn through play, interaction, and instruction, which inspires a love for learning that will last a lifetime.

We encourage learning by providing an environment that promotes higher order thinking skills and creativity through hands-on science inquiry and preschool STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, & math) challenges.



## <u>Curriculum</u>

Our Preschool classes follow the AR Kindergarten Readiness Early Childhood Domains Checklist. This checklist is included in your Parent Folder.

We design our daily instruction to provide active, hands-on learning that includes daily math, phonics, and pre-reading lessons. Our curriculum also includes age-appropriate music, science, language arts, social studies, and handwriting segments that actively engage students.

Handwriting without Tears is utilized for our writing curriculum. This curriculum uses fun, engaging, and develop-mentally appropriate

instructional methods to enable children to master handwriting. The earlier we teach children to master handwriting, the more likely they are to succeed in school, and write with speed and ease in all subjects.

## Contact Info

#### remind

Communicate safely with students & parents.

We use the FREE app <u>REMIND</u> to connect our staff to our parents. This app is a space to receive class announcements and send personal, private messages to your child's teacher. A code will be provided to you so that you can join the class.

Each parent should also "like" the Preschool's Facebook page, which you can find by searching "IBC GO Center Preschool."

After you like the page, we are able to send you an invite to join our <u>Private</u> 2022-2023 IBC Preschool Parent Group. This group allows us to share all of our classroom photos so that you can see what activities your child participates in at preschool!



## Drop Off & Pick Up

#### **Drop Off**

Drop off is from 7:45-8am. You will be issued a key fob which will open the Preschool door during the previously stated drop off time. You may escort your child to their cubby, drop off their belongings, Sign in on our ONE TAP Ipad kiosk and then guide your child into the classroom. Staff members will also be in the hallway to greet you and assist if needed.

#### Pick Uρ:

Pick up begins at 3:30pm and ends at 4:00pm. Please be prompt for pick up. You will again be able to use your key fob to open the Preschool door, Sign your child out on the Ipad, then enter the classroom and pick up your child. Please remember to daily take home your child's backpack, lunch items, and water bottle.

Because your child's safety is of the utmost importance to us, <u>only adults listed on your child's authorized pick-up list may pick up your child.</u> IBC GO Center Preschool must have written consent for any changes to your child's pick up list. Parents may call or email for immediate changes. All authorized individuals, including parents, should be prepared to show picture ID.

Any changes with whom your child normally goes home with need to be communicated in advance to the classroom teacher and preschool director either through Remind or by a phone call!

## **Attendance & Tardies**

Regular, on-time attendance at school is vital to your child's success. Many of our learning experiences take place in the first half of the day, so it is important to be at school on time.

We understand that there may be instances when it is not possible to be here on time. However, please make every effort to have your child at school by 8:00 so we can begin our day together. Habitual tardiness may affect your child's academic progress.

If you are going to be tardy or absent, please contact the school by calling the Preschool Director, LeAnne Lynch at 479-644-3419.



Preschool Late Pick up Fees:

- \$10 flat late fee
- \$1 per minute after 4:00 pm

#### Absence Procedures

We can only accept well children into our care.

IBC GO Center Preschool is not licensed to care for sick children and neither the facilities, nor the staff are equipped to care for contagious children.

Fever controlled medication should not be given to a child in order to attend school!

If a child is found to have lice or to be ill, the child will be removed from the class and parents or guardian will immediately be called. Ill children will rest/wait in the preschool office until guardian(s) arrive to pick them up.

If you find out that your child has a contagious illness, please notify the preschool immediately.

\*\*\*If parents cannot be reached, preschool staff will call the emergency contact provided.

#### Absence Procedures cont.

If you will not be sending your child to school due to illness, please call or text IBC GO Center Preschool at 479-644-3419 and leave a message.

Your child may not attend class if they have a sudden change in health, such as:

- Fever of 100 degrees
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting illness
- Excessive coughing
- Nasal discharge that is NOT Clear
- Mouth sores with drooling
- Rash with fever or behavior change
- Pink eye with white, yellow, or green eye discharge and red "Bloodshot" eyes
- Head lice, until after the first treatment
- Impetigo, until treatment has been started
- Strep throat, until 24 hours after antibiotic treatment has been started
- Pertussis (whooping cough) until 5 days of antibiotic treatment

Please also look out for these sudden changes in behavior:

- Lethargy or lack of responsiveness
- Unexplained irritability or persistent crying
- Difficulty breathing
- Quick-spreading rash

If your child develops a communicable illness or infestation at home, please notify IBC GO Center Preschool as soon as possible!

#### Contagious Illness Policy

Staff are currently <u>not</u> required to wear masks in the classroom.

If a staff member or student tests positive for COVID-19, IBC GO Center will inform the parents. School or individual classroom closures will be at the discretion of the Preschool Program.

COVID Health Check and Illness Policy:

- Fever of 100.4 F or higher, now or in the preceding 72 hours (or would have, but have used fever reducing medicine)
- Cough
- Sore Throat
- Muscle Aches
- Difficulty Breathing
- New Loss of Taste or Smell

Should children or any household member test positive for ANY communicable diseases (COVID-19, strep, flu, etc.), we ask that you notify your primary care physician and the IBC Preschool immediately.

If a child or staff member tests positive for any communicable disease, they are required to be symptom free for 24 hours OR must receive a negative test result in order to return to school.

#### **Medication**

All medications, including over the counter medications, require written instructions and must be authorized by a parent or guardian. This form is available from the IBC GO Center Preschool Director, LeAnne Lynch, and must be on file before medication will be given. This form is required for inhalers as well. If needed, an asthma action plan will be required to be on file.

All prescription medications must be in the original container, and have a prescription label attached to it with the following information:

- Name of the prescribing physician
- Your child's name
- Date issued
- Name and strength of the medication
- Dosage amount
- Time(s) of day it is to be given.

Medications can not be expired and must be age-appropriate. If necessary, dosing instruction for prescription medication must be faxed from your physician's office.

\*\*\*Medication will be stored in a closed container, in a designated cabinet out of reach of ALL children.

#### **Lunch Procedures**

Students will need to bring a packed lunch from home each day.
We request that meals <u>do not</u> require a microwave or refrigerator. We do not have access to a microwave or fridge in

our classroom.

Please keep in mind that a meal should be well-balanced with a choice of a protein, grain, fruit, and vegetable if desired.
Teachers will ensure that water is available in the classroom. If a treat or dessert is packed, then it will be given at the end of lunch to encourage students to consume nutritious food first.

#### **Snack Procedures**

IBC GO Center Preschool will not provide snacks at this time. Please planto send in a nutritious snack for AM AND PM snack times.

Snack examples include: bananas, grapes, sliced apples, sliced oranges, trail mix, Ritz cracker, Graham crackers, and/or cheese squares.

\*You know your child best and what snacks they will eat and enjoy!
\*\*We will have a few prepackaged snacks on hand if your child has missing snacks.

\*Per state licensing, snacks
that are provided will be in an
individual, commercially
pre-packaged container.

## Nap Procedures

After lunch, a nap time period is provided for all children. To protect your child's health, a clean cot marked with your child's name is provided. We ask that you provide a labeled fitted crib sheet, blanket from home. Students are allowed to also bring one stuffed animal.

\*Toddler Class sheets ARE provided.

Nap/Rest time will be approximately 2 hours long. Lights will be turned out and night lights will be used to see children. We will encourage your child to sleep or rest quietly in order to not disturb others. However, if your child does not nap, teachers will provide books or quiet activities to look at.

\*\*\*We currently do not allow students to bring roll out sleeping mats for nap time. Here is an example of what not to bring.



#### **Dress Code**

IBC GO Center Preschool requests that children attend school in comfortable clothing. Dress appropriately for the weather and for playing outside. Washable play clothes and tennis shoes are the most suitable for preschoolers.

Please do not have your child wear sandals or flip flops, as they fall off easily and can cause students to trip. Velcro fastening shoes are recommended, if possible.

A complete change of clothes, including underwear, socks, and shoes will be stored in the Preschool's Office. Please <u>label</u> a zip-lock bag containing these items. We will periodically return this bag and ask parents to check to make sure they still fit and are appropriate for the season.

## **Backpacks**

All students will need a functional backpack large enough to hold an extra set of clothing and naptime bedding.

Backpacks with wheels are NOT allowed; they are too cumbersome and impractical for young children to handle independently.

Backpacks will be used daily for storage of nap bedding so please make sure that your child brings their backpack each day. Many backpacks look alike; please <u>label your child's backpack</u> with their name visible on the <u>outside</u>. A luggage tag is great to label with!

Each child's backpack will be sent home along with their lunch box and water bottle each day.



It is important that everything brought from home be <u>labeled</u> with <u>the child's first and last name</u>.

Children are not to bring toys from home except for show and tell days. IBC GO Center Preschool is not responsible for lost or broken toys.

With the exception of one stuffed animal, which is to remain in your child's cubby until rest time.

Your child's teacher will communicate with you concerning the replacement of any of the required items for your child.

## **Birthday Policy**

Birthdays that occur during the school year are celebrated in each child's classroom. If you wish to provide a "Birthday Treat" you must schedule this with your child's teacher at least one week prior to bringing it to class.

Due to Health Department rules, homemade treats are NOT permitted, please only send pre-packed food. Treats will be given during afternoon snack time.

Holiday and special events will have parent sign-up sheets prior to the event.

\*Please remember that IBC GO center Preschool is <u>NOT</u> a peanut/nut free environment at this time. Other restrictions may apply according to each classroom.

# <u>Classroom Behavior</u> <u>Expectations</u>

We will be teaching green choices (aka expected behaviors) through books and activities all year long. Making green choices is HARD! Each behavior is paired with a visual support. We have a Green and Red Choices chart for visual support in our classroom.

Green choices are "good" behaviors, worded in a positive way. They are the choices we want students to make such as listening, using kind words, and having a calm body. Green is a symbol for go/keep going and red is a symbol for stop.

Green and red choices focus on the choice rather than the child. If a child makes a red choice, a teacher or another student may point it out quietly or simply ask if that's a green choice. The child can then choose to change their behavior and make a green choice.

## Helping My Child

We view our Preschool and your family as a TEAM! Please work with your child on the following skills at home:

- Sharing
- •Reading to your child
- ·Cleaning up
- Recognizing colors
- Recognizing shapes
- •Recognizing/ identifying numbers
- •Recognizing/ identifying letters/ sounds
- Cutting with scissors
- •Buttoning, snapping, zipping, and tying
- Opening packages for snack and lunch
- Toilet training and independent cleanliness, including an emphasis on handwashing
- \* Your child MUST be potty trained to attend IBC

GO Center Preschool.

## Parent Conferences

We will be holding parent conferences twice this year, once in November and again in April.

At the preschool level, a parent/teacher conference is intended to be a checkpoint for monitoring growth from Fall to Spring. Teachers will provide an assessment covering basic learning skills and share any observations about the social-emotional well being of your child.

Your child's portfolio will be available to view samples of what your child is accomplishing in the classroom. This portfolio will be sent home with your child at the end of the school year!

\*\*We do not plan to require parent teacher conferences for our toddler class. However, you are always welcome to schedule a conference with your child's teacher at any time.

#### Preschool Closings

IBC GO Center follows its own school calendar, but will follow Rogers School District for inclement weather days.

IBC GO Center Preschool Holiday Closings:

Labor Day: September 5th

Thanksgiving Break: November 21st-25th

Christmas Break:

December 21st-January 2nd

Spring Break: March 20th-24th

Weather related closings will not be refunded, and days will not be added at the end of the school year. Parents should tune into local radio/television stations for weather related school closing info. Information regarding day-of closing due to inclement weather will also be communicated through Remind.

\*\*If Rogers Public Schools are closed for <u>inclement weather</u>, IBC Preschool will also be closed.

## Payment Policy

It is preferred that you set up an account through our online giving portal, subsplash.com.

Tuition Payments need to be scheduled to be processed each week. You may pay weekly, monthly, or pre-pay a set amount.

Your prompt payment each month is vital for the financial well-being of our preschool operations and staff.

IBC GO Center Preschool has determined the tuition price to compare with an average tuition price per month.

Tuition is non-refundable for <u>personal days</u>, <u>inclement weather</u>, <u>or professional development days</u>.

#### Withdrawal Policy

It is our policy that a 2-week written notice is given for withdrawing a child. Upon withdrawal, your child's tuition needs to be <u>paid in full</u>. IBC GO Center Preschool reserves the right to refuse service to any child and/ or family member for any reason including those exhibiting unacceptable behavior.

#### **Key Fob Policy**

You will be assigned 1 Key Fob to use throughout the School Year. This fob will allow you entrance through the Preschool Door at these designated times:

• Drop Off: 7:45-8:15

• Pick Up: 3:15-4:00

A second additional key fob is available Upon Request. A third key fob will be \$10.

At the end of the school year you will be expected to return all key fobs, or will have to pay the replacement fee.

There is a \$10 Replacement Fee for all lost key fobs.

#### Late Pick Up Policy

If you are running late to either drop off or pick up, you will need to contact the Preschool phone at (479) 644-3419 or send a Remind Message directly to your child's teacher.

The following late fees could be applicable if late to pick up:

• \$10 flat late fee

+\$1 per minute late

#### 2-3s Tuition Pricing

Toddler Tuition is set at \$50/day, starting with 2 days at \$100, 3 days for \$150, 4 days for \$200, and 5 days for \$250.

#### 3s-4s Tuition Pricing

Tuesday/Thursday-\$78/week
\*\*\*we are currently only offering a T/Th
class for 3-4yo.

#### 4s-5s Tuition Pricing

Days	Price
Tuesday/Thursday	\$78/week
Mon/Wed/Fri	\$116/week
Monday-Friday	\$192/week

- A \$100 Registration fee, per family is due at the beginning of the school year.
- A \$50, per child, Curriculum/Supply fee is due at the beginning of each semester.
- There will be a 10% discount given for the tuition of a 2nd child.
