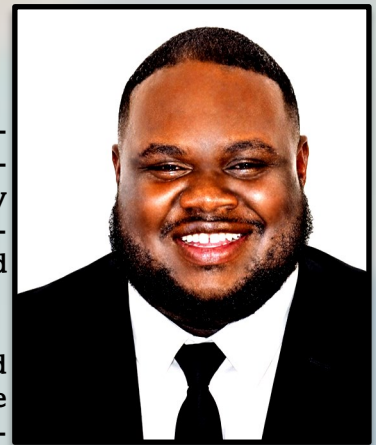

The Reverend Tevin D. Smith



A native of Greenville, South Carolina, the Reverend Tevin D. Smith is a devoted preacher, educator, historian, and community leader who has dedicated his life to service in both church and community. Rev. Smith formerly served as Pastor of Mount Olive Baptist Church in Greenville, South Carolina, where his dynamic preaching and compassionate leadership impacted many lives.

Rev. Smith accepted his call to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ in 2012 and was licensed in November 2013 at Rock of Ages Baptist Church under the pastorate of Rev. Terry A. King. Answering the call with diligence and faithfulness, he was ordained in July 2018 by the Reedy River Baptist Association.

Educated in the public schools of Greenville County, Rev. Smith is a 2010 graduate of Southside High School. He furthered his education at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Applied Liberal Studies. While at Morgan State, he was an active member of the world-renowned Morgan State University Choir and served as student pastor at the historic university Memorial Chapel. He has also pursued additional studies at Morris College, Anderson University, and Benedict College. Rev. Smith is currently employed with the Greenville County School District, where he continues to impact young lives through education.

A passionate advocate for higher education, Rev. Smith strongly encourages young people to apply to and attend Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), believing in their transformative power both academically and culturally. He is also an active member of the Morgan State University Alumni Association.

Rev. Smith is deeply engaged in ministry and denominational work. He previously served as Assistant Dean of the Congress of Christian Education for the Enoree River Baptist Association and currently serves as Historian for the Progressive National Baptist Convention, where he also contributes as a Congress Instructor. His commitment to preserving history extends beyond the church, as he is a dedicated curator and historian of African-American history.

His community involvement is extensive. Rev. Smith is an active member of the Baptist Ministers' Fellowship of Greenville and Vicinity, the Progressive National Baptist Convention, the Greenville Branch of the NAACP, and the Greenville Chapter of the Rainbow PUSH Coalition. He also serves on the Board of Directors for Greenville Light Opera Works Lyric Theatre, is a member of the Greenville Chorale, a board member of the Greenville County Historical Society, and serves on the Richland Cemetery Advisory Committee. Additionally, he is a proud member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

Gifted in the arts, Rev. Smith has a deep love for the fine and performing arts, including singing, acting, and teaching oratory and theater. He is the founder and artistic director of the annual Christmas Extravaganza, a beloved seasonal event, and serves as Executive Director and Founding Director of the Historic Former Black High Schools of Greenville Chorale. Through these efforts, he continues to preserve culture, inspire creativity, and uplift the community.

Rev. Smith's passions include community activism, mentoring youth, researching African-American history, and ministering to the elderly. Above all, he remains committed to preaching the Gospel and winning souls to Christ.

He is the proud son of Ms. Kimberly D. Smith. Guided by his faith, Rev. Smith lives by the motto: *"If I can help somebody as I travel along, then my living shall not be in vain."* His lifelong mission is to seek and please God while introducing as many people as possible to Jesus Christ.

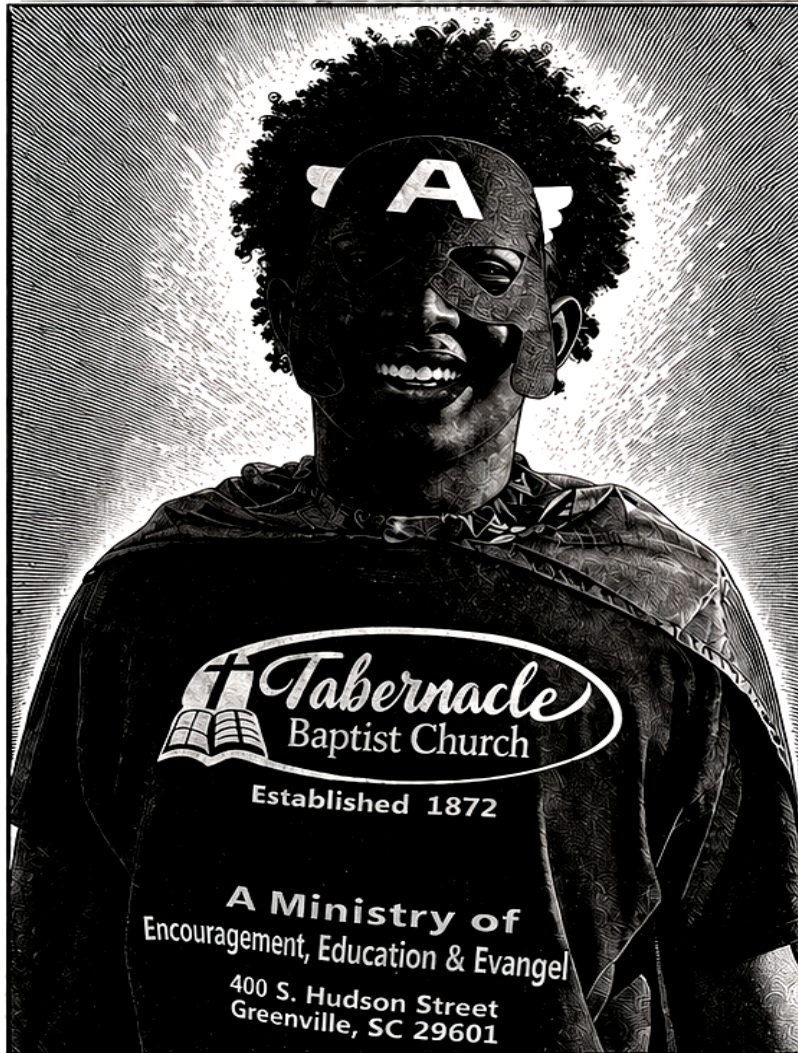

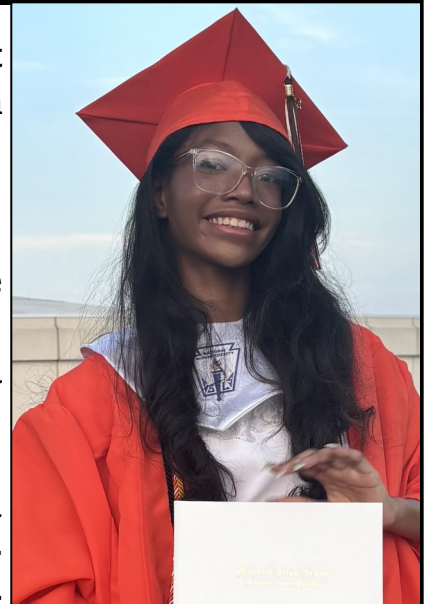
