Reading the Bible Through

By: Crystal McGee DePue If you're looking for a fantastic gift to give yourself in the New Year, I suggest accepting the challenge to read the Bible through!

This year, we at First Pres are being challenged to commit to reading the Bible through, preferably in a year using the FPCE App (So easy! It calls up the passage and you can choose the written translation or use the ESV audio format!!)...but it's OK if it takes you longer or you choose to read from your Bible.

What are the benefits? I was astonished by all the parts of the Bible that never made it into Sunday school lessons or sermons—and it was so helpful to be able to fit those Sunday school stories into God's overarching story. Turns out "ALL Scripture is God-breathed and useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness." (II Tim 3:16) The more I read, the more hooked I became on reading through annually, as it not only sets the focus of my day on Him, but also enhances whatever other Bible studies I'm in.

Tim Hast got hooked, too. He's now on his 16th contiguous year of reading through the Bible. He got started simply by seeing Mike Laska reading a One-Year Bible and felt moved to give it a try. It was March, so he just started there and read until the next March, when he realized how healing and helpful it had been during what was a very emotionally rough season, so he just continued... and hasn't stopped!

Like the Psalmist who said "I've hidden your word in my heart" (Psalm 119:11), Tim found that reading a portion of the Bible every day throughout the year until he's read it all allows the Word of God "to settle deeply in my soul. When I'm struggling, I have His Word to recall and to comfort me."

Personally, I find that reading through has greatly enriched my understanding of God and His plan for His beloved creation. Not only do the Bible stories begin to fit together, but current history begins to take on a different hue when my vision is corrected daily to the heavenly/eternal view of His Kingdom.


In full disclosure, I quit on my first two tries when I was a teen...but there was no one doing it alongside

FIRST, BY THE NUMBERS

Revenues

Total revenues for November were \$196,057. This is \$414 less than budgeted revenues of \$196,471 or 99.8% of budget.

Expenses

Total net expenses for November were \$147,574, which was \$47,812 less than budgeted net expenses of \$195,386 or 75.5% of budget.

After School Program

Central Middle School's After School Program started in 2017 by opening the doors of our church to a former student, Garrett Crouch, and some of his friends by providing a space to come and practice soccer after they got out of school. It provided a safe space for them to wait for their parents to pick them up. Before we knew it, FPCE's gym went from having about 8 boys coming over to roughly 60+ students filling the space and taking it over.

At the time, FPCE's Student Ministry was praying for a way to connect with Central Middle School and saw this as their answer. Soon it shifted to a completely different structure of its own, being run by a handful of interns and some

amazing volunteers by giving their time to pour into and connect with the students.

"My friends went there and it seemed like it would be fun to come and check out! I kept coming back because of Will and Brynnan getting to know me by name and connecting with me... Will gave me the opportunity to help in the Filling Station serving snacks and drinks. I liked being able to help around"-Alysa Nixon, After School Student

"I started going to After School to do something and be able to hangout with my friends. I liked it a lot! That's where I got to play basketball all the time and got to hang out with Will and Jake" -Carson Seely, After School Student

Today, nearly 6 years since the start

of After School, it continues to grow and develop as a ministry of its own. Taking place on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 2:00-4:30, a group of Student Ministry interns continue to take on and lead the program. Opening the doors to our building and inviting students in for a space to wait for rides, do homework, play games in the gym, and a space for community and fellowship has proven to be impactful in their lives. After School has also served as a bridge to invite students to join us for Wednesday night church activities.

"I liked to spend time with all my friends once we got out of school. It was fun to hang out with Will and give me something to do while waiting for my ride. I loved everyone's company and the church has raised me for 4 years now." -Alex Crittendon, After School Student
