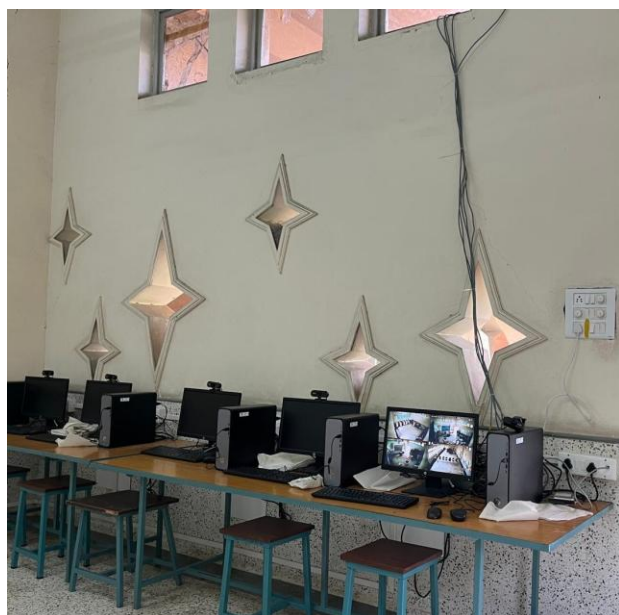




You Have Got to Be Kidding

The government exams for state-run courses (Computer, Electrician, Preschool Teacher Training and Fashion Designing) began this week. All staff and students were seriously preparing for the upcoming busy schedule. But there was a visit from a government external officer who came to check our facility and classrooms and after he went back, we were asked to install cameras in five classrooms only four days before the exams.

The students have completed their practical examinations and will soon be appearing for their theory exams in the coming week.
