She's been dating another man for a few months, and he is very supportive and patient with her which is exactly what she needs. She seems much happier overall. We just had his parents at our house yesterday and they are very kind and funny and we spent the afternoon just chatting with them.

Roxie is improving physically. The concussion turned out to be a severe neck sprain, but then the medications caused a secondary infection, so it's been a longer recovery than we expected. But she's doing much better 😊

Mentally, though, it's been a rough few weeks. The bus company is trying to get someone to pay for a new windshield and lost business while the bus was being repaired. They are threatening to sue her for approximately \$8000 for breaking their windshield with her head.

It's funny how different the cultures are. In the U.S., I imagine we'd have already been contacted by a lawyer saying, "Congratulations—you have a great personal injury case!" It's a little bit different here.

I also wanted to mention an answer to prayer. I mentioned our neighbors Pavel and Martina in my last email, and how we wanted to meet with them without being too "pushy". A few days after I sent the email we had a call and they asked if they could come over. It turned out they were planning a summer vacation and wanted our help calling the hotel because neither of them speak English. We ended up talking for a long time and already set up times to meet again. God was one step ahead of us 🙏

How is everything going back at FBC? I'm grateful for the weekly emails that they send out. It helps me feel connected.
