# LOCAL MINISTRY FAIR

The Chili Cook-Off provided an opportunity to highlight several of our closest local ministry partners and learn how we can continue to support their work in our community. Each ministry will use the funds raised to meet a specific need this holiday season.



**Hope Haven** – Hope Haven’s wheelchair ministry empowers individuals with disabilities by sending wheelchairs globally. Funds will be used to add essential tools to each pediatric wheelchair being sent to underserved communities.

**Family Crisis Center** – The Family Crisis Center promotes safety, healing, and freedom for families recovering from trauma. Funds are going towards a specific family’s needs as they continue their journey toward stability and healing.

**Pioneer Home** – The Pioneer Home provides affordable, Christian, and independent living for senior citizens in our community.

**Whispers of Love, Hope, and Joy** – Whispers empowers women and children who are survivors of domestic violence. This past year, The Genesis House joined with Whispers, merging boards and resources to strengthen their shared mission of healing and restoration. They will use the funds to host a special holiday celebration for families living on campus.

**ATLAS** – As a Christian mentoring organization, ATLAS focuses on truth, love, and self-control through meaningful mentoring relationships. Funds will help support the mentors who continue walking alongside those seeking guidance.



# Youth Ministry

It's been a full and fun fall for our youth ministry. Since kickoff in September, we've had more students and adult leaders than ever before. September highlights included students serving at Legacy Thrift, making soup and cookie mix jars for local families, and joining other area youth groups for a High School Worship Night at Christ Chapel for Rocky+. # A New Partnership in Brazil

This fall, Pastor Fred and I traveled to Brazil to visit Igreja Presbiteriana de Manaus (IPM), a large, thriving church passionate about outreach and evangelism along the Amazon River. We were invited to see how their ministry supports missionaries and reaches remote communities with both medical care and the gospel. While there, we met two men whose stories resonated with our global strategies as a church -Jesse and Edmundo, from the Hixkaryana, an indigenous tribe deep in the Amazon.



Jesse serves as a Bible translator. He has already completed the New Testament in the Hixkaryana language and is now working on the Old Testament. For the first time, his people will have access to the full Word of God in their own language.

Edmundo, the son of the tribe's chief, plays a vital role in opening the door for ministry within their community. Because of his relationship and leadership, there is now an opportunity for gospel partnership with a group that has been largely unreached. Our church is exploring a possible partnership with Edmundo and his family through IPM, giving FRC a direct connection with an indigenous people group in Brazil.

### Hope for Haiti

Thank you to everyone who came to hear Pascal Neary from Children of the Promise (COTP) share about what's next for Haiti. COTP continues to care for children in crisis while working toward healthy Christian family placements. One key focus of their mission is family strengthening through education, which is vital for the foundation of strong families, communities, and a thriving nation.

COTP recently received exciting news: Digicel, Haiti's leading phone company, has chosen them for a generous gift—partnering with them for a new school facility that will make education accessible to students with special needs. Digicel will fund and build the facility, while COTP will contribute 10% of the cost and furnish the building. To help reach their \$80,000 goal, you can join us in supporting this project.

### Guaymas, Mexico

After this past fiscal year, the Missions Team was entrusted with a portion of the church's financial surplus to meet pressing needs among our partners. One need stood out - the churches in Guaymas, Mexico, needed a reliable 15-passenger van. The one used during our visit to Guaymas was borrowed and falling apart, yet vital for transporting pastors to trainings and bringing children to weekly programs and meals.

Because of border regulations and title transfer challenges, we decided to purchase a van in Mexico. In September, Randy Vande Griend and Sara Van Zee traveled to Guaymas with two leaders from Emmanuel Church in California to explore options and make the purchase. With Randy's guidance and the leadership of the church in Guaymas, we found the right van.

This van has already been a great blessing, providing reliable transportation for ministry and outreach. Thank you for giving generously!
