On Sunday, August 17, our church family gathered for a sacred milestone, the commissioning of the Rau family to the mission field. What began as a prayerful longing to see the unreached know Christ has now become reality. The Raus have spent the past year walking with a Prayer and Care Team, preparing their hearts, and seeking God's direction. We have witnessed their journey of surrender, courage, and obedience as they follow Christ's words in Matthew 10:39: *"He that loses his life for my sake shall find it."*

Their sending is not just about one family. It is an extension of our whole church. Through prayer, encouragement, and support, we all share in the mission of taking the gospel to places where Christ's name has never been proclaimed. The Raus will serve in Western Asia, beginning with language learning, cultural understanding, and biblical application, so they may bring the good news of Jesus to those who have yet to hear.

Part of this sending was made possible through the generosity of our congregation and community. During RAGBRAI, our church came together in extraordinary ways—cooking, serving, and opening our doors to thousands. It was a living picture of the church in Acts: giving time, talents, and possessions in Christ's name. Through that effort, and the love of so many, the Raus' fundraiser raised approximately \$15,750.

As we commission the Raus, let us continue to stand with them. This is holy ground—our church's prayers, resources, and faith joining in God's mission to the world.

# Compton Reflections

One of the greatest indicators that the gospel has truly taken root in a culture is when it begins to break cycles and chains that have held generations captive. Compton is no different.

This summer was our first time bringing a team to Compton during the summer months—and our first time bringing a truly multi-generational group. Honestly, I wasn't sure how that would affect our "normal" way of serving. I even wondered if we would be able to accomplish all the tasks we had planned.

As the week unfolded, I noticed something different—more moments of relational play, more unhurried conversations. I wondered what the community at City Church thought about this shift. By the end of the week, my questions were answered. Several people approached me with tears in their eyes, sharing how deeply it moved them to see families serving side-by-side. They were encouraged to watch the younger team members take time to truly see the children of the community.

For those in Compton who are already working hard to break destructive cycles, witnessing faith lived out across generations was a powerful reminder that this journey can be passed on—and it gave them renewed hope for their own families.

What I initially saw as a possible weakness, God used to reveal His glory. He reminded us of His promise to work through generations. We're excited to create more opportunities for people of all ages to serve together and express the rich heritage of faith in action.
