WHEN JOY WALKS THROUGH THE CROSS

Dear Fair View Family,

As we journey toward Holy Week and the bright dawn of Easter morning, I've been thinking a lot about joy—not the thin, fragile kind that depends on everything going right, but the deep, steady joy that Christ carried even as He walked toward the cross.

Because if we're honest, joy is something many of us struggle to hold onto.

The Quiet Thieves of Joy

Joy rarely disappears in one dramatic moment. More often, it's stolen quietly by familiar voices:

- Fear that whispers we're not enough
- Shame that tells us we're too broken
- Control that convinces us everything depends on us
- Comparison that drains our gratitude
- Suffering that makes us believe joy is impossible

These thieves show up in our homes, our work, our relationships, even in our spiritual lives. And when they do, joy can feel like a luxury we can't afford.

But the Passion of Christ tells a different story.

The Cross That Refused to Kill Joy

When we picture the cross, joy is not the first word that comes to mind. Yet Scripture dares to say:

"For the joy set before Him, He endured the cross." (Hebrews 12:2)

Jesus didn't wait for joy on the other side of suffering. He carried joy into suffering.

Not because the cross was easy. Not because the pain was small. Not because the betrayal didn't cut deep.

He carried joy because He knew:

- The Father's love was unshakeable
- Redemption was unfolding
- Humanity was being restored
- Darkness would not have the final word

The cross did not negate His joy. The cross revealed the depth of His joy.

A Holy Week Challenge

As we step into the sacred days ahead, I want to challenge you—gently but boldly—to look for joy in the very places you assume it cannot exist.

- Where fear has been loud, look for the joy of God's steady presence.
- Where shame has lingered, look for the joy of Christ's forgiveness.
- Where suffering has weighed heavy, look for the joy of resurrection hope.

Joy is not the absence of pain. Joy is the presence of purpose, love, and God's nearness—even in the shadows.

The cross is not the end of the story. The tomb is not the end of the story. The darkness is not the end of the story.

Joy rises. Joy returns. Joy rolls stones away.

So as we walk through the Passion together, may we do so with eyes open—not only to the sorrow, but to the joy that refuses to die.

Because the same joy that carried Jesus to the cross is the joy that carried Him out of the grave. And it is the joy He now places in us.

Prayer

Lord Jesus,
As we walk with You toward the cross and toward Easter's dawn, fill us with the joy that cannot be stolen. Where fear, shame, or sorrow linger, let Your presence be our strength. Let the joy that carried You through the darkness rise within us and lead us into resurrection hope.

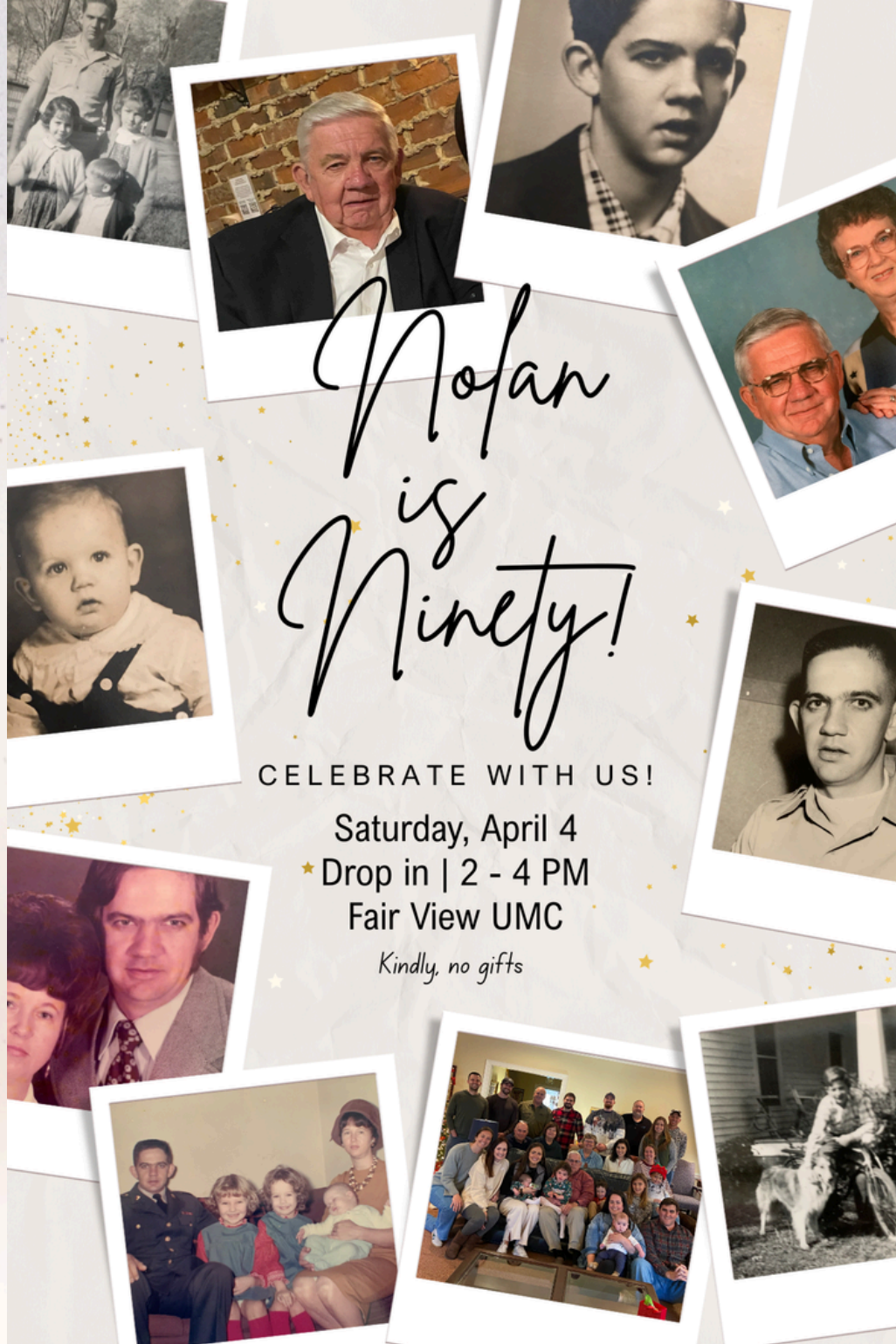

Upper Room

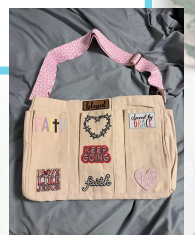
Wesley, Wednesdays 11- Noon


