## What We Believe

First Baptist Church of Douglasville (FBC) is an autonomous church that is aligned with the Southern Baptist Convention. Our beliefs and our governing by-laws reflect the doctrinal positions and intent of the Baptist Faith and Message 2000. A complete copy of the Baptist Faith and Message as well as our by-laws can be found at <u>www.gofbcd.org</u>. We have summarized our essential doctrinal beliefs and covenant membership in the following sections.

## **Essential Doctrinal Beliefs**

#### God

We believe there is one true God, who exists as three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We affirm that He is the Creator, Preserver, and Ruler of all things. He is perfect and infinite in all His attributes and is worthy of the highest love, reverence, and obedience.

#### Man

We believe God created man in His own image and free from sin in order to reflect His glory; but, through the temptation of Satan, man sinned (rebelled against God) and incurred both a physical death and a spiritual death (eternal separation from God). We believe that all human beings are born with a sin nature and are thus incapable of rendering to God the highest love, reverence, and obedience, which He is due.

#### Jesus Christ

We believe that God the Son is Jesus Christ, who is the divinely appointed Mediator between God and man. Having taken upon Himself human nature, He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born, without sin, of the virgin Mary to redeem man from sin. He perfectly fulfilled the Law, and He suffered and died upon the cross for the salvation of sinners. He was buried; He was raised on the third day; and He ascended to His Father in heaven. He is able to save those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them.

#### **Salvation**

We believe salvation involves the redemption of the whole man (intellect, desires, and will), and is offered freely to all who would repent of their sins and believe upon Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, who by His own perfect life, substitutionary death on the cross, and resurrection from the dead obtained eternal redemption for the believer. We believe that salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, and is not based on any works man may do.

#### <u>The Bible</u>

We believe the Scriptures of the Old Testament and New Testament were given by inspiration of God, and therefore are inerrant and infallible. We believe the Scriptures are the only sufficient, certain, and authoritative rule of all saving knowledge, faith, and Christian obedience. The Scriptures are therefore to be believed, as God's instruction, in all that it teaches; obeyed, as God's command, in all that it requires; and trusted, as God's pledge, in all that it promises (Isaiah 40:6-8). As God's people hear, believe, and obey the Word, they are equipped as disciples of Christ and witnesses to the gospel (Romans 10:14-17).

#### Affirming Biblical View of Marriage

We believe and affirm biblical marriage is the uniting of one naturally born man and one naturally born woman in covenant commitment for a lifetime. It is through marriage that God has ordained the family as the foundational institution of human society (Genesis 2:18-25).

## Affirming Sanctity of Human Life

We believe and affirm that all human beings are image bearers of God, thus, we affirm the unique value of all human life from conception to the point of death (Psalm 139).

## <u>The Church</u>

We believe the Lord Jesus is the Head of the Church, which is composed of all His true disciples, and He possesses all power for its government. While FBC is a part of the Southern Baptist Convention, we practice self-government and independence from any denominational control, and we team up with other networks for greater impact. FBC determines its own strategy, structure, and style.

We believe the body of Christ (the Church) has been put here to display the glory of God through making disciples, worship, and proclaiming the gospel here in West Atlanta and throughout the world.

The Church has been commanded to observe two ordinances: **baptism** and the **Lord's Supper**.

## Baptism

We practice baptism by complete immersion – the way Jesus was baptized and the way the Bible commands. Baptism is a visible picture of a person's commitment to Christ and a sign of his fellowship with Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection, of the remission of his sins, and of his giving himself up to live unto God in newness of life. Baptism is also a prerequisite to enjoying the privileges of church membership and to participating in the Lord's Supper.

"...buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God..." (Colossians 2:12)

## Lord's Supper

We practice the Lord's Supper on a regular basis. It is a symbolic act of obedience through which we remember the death of Jesus and anticipate His second coming. All who have become genuine followers of Christ and have been baptized by immersion can participate.

"For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." (1 Corinthians 11:26)

## **Covenant Membership**

We take membership seriously. Committing yourself to a body of believers is an important decision. Throughout the New Testament, we are instructed to meet together (Hebrews 10:24-25). We are to use our gifts to build up our church family (Ephesians 4:15-16).

When covenant members join our church, they commit to a spiritual family that provides encouragement and support (1 Peter 3:8). They are also called to a biblical degree of responsibility, service, and sacrifice to their brothers and sisters in Christ. The Bible teaches that our lives are best lived and expressed in the context of community. We are not meant to live this life on our own.

We are told that pastors are to exercise leadership and care for church members (Hebrews 13:17), and that they are accountable to God for the souls of their people. Our pastors take this responsibility seriously by providing care for the members through the ministry leaders and ministries of our church. Our pastors commit to come alongside our covenant members with care, counsel, prayer, and teaching. Therefore, it is critical for pastors to be able to identify who belongs to the church.

#### **Requirements of Membership**

The requirements for membership are as follows:

- 1. Attend First Connection
- 2. Share your faith story with us
  - A point when you have accepted Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior
  - A time subsequent to that when you have been baptized by immersion
- 3. Sign or affirm our Covenant Commitment Card indicating your agreement with our core doctrinal beliefs

#### **Expectations of Membership**

The Bible describes the church as one body with many members (1 Corinthians 12:12-31). Not all members are alike and not all members serve the same purpose, but all members are needed to do their part for the whole body to function properly. Unlike membership in a country club where a person pays their dues and expects to be served, covenant membership within the church comes with the expectation that its members get involved in the mission of the church. So, what are some of the basic expectations?

- 1. Regular worship attendance
- 2. Faithful giving
- 3. Commitment to being discipled through a small group Bible study
- 4. Commitment to service
- 5. Commitment to being a disciple-maker by living on mission

#### How and Why We Give

We encourage everyone to have a plan for giving, expressed through a lifestyle of generosity. This means we ask everyone to prayerfully consider how they will support the church with their time, talents, and financial resources. Giving strengthens our devotion to Christ and frees us to live open-handedly with the gifts God has given to each of us. As people of faith, giving is an expression of worship and one of the ways we proclaim the gospel.

We feel it is important to let you know what your giving accomplishes. All money that is given at FBC goes to support the ministries and mission of FBC as we seek to reach our community and beyond for Christ. Also, as part of the Southern Baptist Convention, we are part of supporting thousands of missionaries and church planters. Part of the resources given to FBC are sent to the SBC and that money is used to support over 5,000 International missionaries and hundreds of North American church planters. In addition to those efforts, resources go to supporting the six SBC seminaries with the mission of educating thousands of pastors and missionaries, all with the goal of expanding the kingdom and proclaiming the gospel of Christ.

#### Young Adult

The Young Adult Ministry exists to lead those age 18-25+ to "glorify God by making disciples and proclaiming the gospel throughout the world." In a world of ever-increasing secularism and challenges to our faith, it is vital that these young adults are prepared to engage the world around them with the life-changing message of the gospel. Our desire is to see the gospel of Jesus Christ take root in the lives of our young adults in West Atlanta and around the world.

#### Median and Senior Adults

We define Sunday School as a community of people connected for discipleship through Bible study, prayer, and spiritually encouraging relationships. We offer several different options for weekly women's Bible studies, a yearly conference or retreat, and other engaging events throughout the year.

#### Hispanic Ministry | Javier Lopez

In November 2022, we launched a Hispanic Ministry at FBCD. God has blessed us with a vision to be a multicultural church, and we are thankful for his continued grace as that vision is being realized. The Hispanic Ministry is not another church, but a part of the First Baptist family worshiping and serving the Lord in another language. It is a dynamic and vibrant ministry with believers from 14 different countries represented and new members joining each week. There are adult discipleship classes available on Wednesdays at 6:30 pm and Sundays at 9:15 am. Then, at 10:45 am on Sundays, we have a Spanish worship service that meets in the Student Room.

Though we are an autonomous church, we are a part of a network of churches within the West Metro Baptist Association and the Georgia Baptist Convention and the greater network called the Southern Baptist Convention. This means that locally we are able to operate as an independent church, but we have the advantage of linking arms with over 40,000 churches to impact North America and the world for Christ. A portion of every dollar you give goes to a cooperative partnership that funds this mission endeavor as well as other entities, which benefit our church.

#### International Mission Board – Richmond, VA

IMB partners with churches to empower missionary teams who are making disciples and multiplying churches among unreached peoples and places for the glory of God. The IMB has a training center that prepares and sends these missionaries into action. In just one year's time, field personnel shared the message of Jesus with 1.7 million people and started 6,200 churches.

NAMB exists to work with churches, associations, and state conventions in mobilizing Southern Baptists as a missional force to impact North America through evangelism and church planting. It is also the second largest disaster relief organization in the nation bringing help to people and places in times of crisis.



## A Brief History of First Baptist Church

- 1875 FBC Douglasville was established with 25 members and pastor W.A. Lane.
- 1896 The original building was struck by lightning and burned down. The pastor at that time was J.J. Oxford and he led in the construction of a new brick building.
- 1919 FBC had grown to approximately 200 members.
- 1940 The church began to remodel and build to accommodate the growth of the church.
- 1949 Under the leadership of Pastor Pat Johnson, FBC added an educational building containing 35 classrooms.
- 1958 The building that currently sits on Church Street in downtown Douglasville was built under the leadership of Pastor Dr. O.M. Seigler and Dr. Milton Dwelle.
- 1985 The Church Street building was remodeled, and additional education space added under Dr. Woodrow Hudson.
- 2000 Under the leadership of Dr. John Pennington, FBC relocated to its present location on the corner of Prestley Mill Road and Timber Ridge.
- 2017 After 27 years of faithful ministry, Dr. Pennington retires from FBC, and the church called Tim Akin to be the new pastor.
- 2022 We began our ALL IN campaign to renovate the Worship Center and other projects on campus. In November we started the Hispanic Worship Services under the leadership of Pastor Javier Lopez.
- Today FBC is poised to expand its reach with the gospel. While we are still a community church, we see our mission as going beyond Douglasville, to our country and throughout the world.

## **Steps for Membership**

## 1. Attend First Connection

This is the front door to our church family. You will learn about the history of our church and how to get connected, grow, and serve. You will get a chance to meet your pastors, church leaders, and others like yourself who are taking steps towards getting connected. This one-time class is a requirement for membership.

## 2. Share Your Faith Story with Us

In order to join our church, you should be able to tell us about how you understood you needed to turn from your sin and put your faith in Jesus. If you have never done that or if you are not able to articulate your story well, we will help you!

Then, share with us your baptism experience. If you have never been baptized by immersion, we will be glad to schedule an appointment to talk through your story and plan to celebrate your baptism.

If you have been a member of another church within our network (Southern Baptist church), we will be glad to follow up with your church to officially transfer membership records.

## 3. Sign Our Covenant Commitment Card

Very simply, this affirms your decision to become a Covenant Member. The Covenant Commitment Card will be signed before you are presented to the church.

## **Covenant Commitment Card**

Having received Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, and having experienced baptism by immersion, and being in agreement with the doctrinal beliefs of First Baptist (see Baptist Faith and Message 2000), I commit myself to God and to the members of First Baptist to do the following:

## 1. The Bible

I commit myself to the regular reading and studying of God's Word, acknowledging that it is the only sufficient, certain, and infallible rule of all saving knowledge, faith, and obedience.

## 2. Discipleship

I commit myself to growing as a disciple by attending church faithfully, being a regular and consistent giver, having a commitment to serving within the church, and being part of a small group.

## 3. Missions

I commit to supporting the mission of First Baptist by having gospel conversations with people where I live, work, and play as well as supporting mission opportunities by going myself or supporting those who do go through my prayer and financial support.
