We have a full schedule in April with churches lined up to present in as well. We are very thankful that King James Bible Ministries and Bethel Independent Baptist Church afforded us the opportunity to travel and share a table with them at several churches. What an enormous blessing our sending church has been to our family and ministry. They truly exemplify the love of Christ and compassion that is making a difference towards the saints. They also have a heartbeat for missions and church planting. It is a privilege and an honour to be able to represent this great church as we endeavor to serve the LORD faithfully with them, raise our support, and ultimately minister in Labasa, Fiji.

February was a great month with meetings and a lot of snow. We started out in King Ferry, New York spending some time with our sending church and getting ready for our time on the road. Our first stop in our meetings was in West Virginia and later two more churches in Kentucky. We were very excited about going to Narrow Way Baptist Church and spending time with Pastor Murray. It snowed pretty hard while we were there and we almost didn't know if we were going to be able to finish our trip.
