Most of all Ken needs to join a Biblical Church and be busy for the Lord. He really needs to also get a job, but tries harder to prove that he has a disability than to just get a job. Along with these struggles Ken's brother hung him self on Christmas Eve. A truly selfish act that has hurt many. I don't know Ken's family, but I do know that they would surely appreciate us all praying for them.

We had Thanksgiving in the new room we built for the church services. It was awesome, we had 16 folks at the table, all with much to be thankful for. Some from the local area here in Chatanika, some from the Air Force Base. God has been so good to us so that we have been able to share with others.

Harvey has been doing well with his new lot in life. Every month he gets better at living with the new disabilities that he has. He has been a good example to others here as well, in that he is continuing in his previous job. It has been an adjustment for him, but he is adjusting. She almost runs up and down the road more than me. She sure is a blessing though stopping in on us, and calling us often. It has been a while since we have seen Margret as she has been going down south for cancer treatment, and Audre has been in Fairbanks taking care of her daughter Crystal and schooling her grand daughters.

This past Sunday we had Richard, Sonya, and Willie in services up in Circle, Harvey and I made the trip. It was a great trip enabling Harvey and I to have a much needed discussion on the "Lord's Supper". What it is, and what it is not. We are intending to observe the Lord's Supper Wednesday the 18th and needed to have some one on one instruction.
