

Pastor Roy's Study Questions on Luke 17:1-19 **(May 31, 2026)**

— *Below are questions to help further our understanding of today's sermon.* —

1. In what ways do we sometimes expect rewards or recognition from God before we have faithfully completed the work He has called us to do, and how does this attitude reflect a misunderstanding of our servant relationship with Him?
2. When faced with temptation, what practical steps can we take to ensure we are walking in step with the Holy Spirit rather than at a distance from Him?
3. How does the warning in Matthew 18:6-7 about causing little ones to sin challenge our responsibility as believers in protecting children from the moral compromises of our culture?
4. What does it mean to have faith the size of a mustard seed, and why do you think Jesus emphasizes the quality of faith over the quantity?
5. How does the command to rebuke and forgive a brother who sins against you seven times in one day challenge our natural inclinations toward holding grudges or limiting forgiveness?
6. Why do you think nine of the ten lepers failed to return and give thanks to Jesus, and in what ways might we be guilty of receiving God's blessings without expressing gratitude?
7. What is the difference between doing our duty as servants of Christ and seeking to earn salvation through our works, and how do we maintain this balance in our daily walk?
8. How does the Samaritan's response to his healing demonstrate true saving faith compared to the other nine who were also physically healed?
9. In what areas of your life are you most vulnerable to the prowling adversary described in 1 Peter 5:8, and what safeguards have you put in place to remain sober-minded and watchful?
10. How should the reality that God will hold us to a higher account as His disciples impact the way we conduct ourselves and represent Christ in a crooked and twisted generation?
