

Pastor Roy's Study Questions on Luke 19:1-27 **(June 28, 2026)**

— *Below are questions to help further our understanding of today's sermon.* —

1. How does the story of Zacchaeus challenge our own assumptions about who is redeemable and worthy of God's grace?
2. In what ways might fear be paralyzing your faith and preventing you from being a faithful steward of what God has given you?
3. What does it mean that Jesus actively seeks sinners rather than waiting for them to come to Him, and how should this shape our approach to evangelism?
4. How do you respond to the reality that God has never sent anyone to Hell, but rather people make a conscious choice to reject salvation?
5. What spiritual gifts, resources, or opportunities has God entrusted to you, and are you actively using them for His kingdom or keeping them wrapped up like the servant with the handkerchief?
6. Why do you think the religious leaders were more upset about Jesus dining with a sinner than they were joyful about a sinner being transformed?
7. How does Zacchaeus's immediate and joyful response to Jesus contrast with the rich young ruler's response, and what does this reveal about true repentance?
8. What does it mean to have an intimate relationship with Jesus that casts out fear and keeps you on the right path, and how can you cultivate that closeness daily?
9. If you were to stand before Christ today and give an account of your stewardship, would you hear well done good and faithful servant, and what changes might you need to make?
10. How does the parable of the ten minas reveal that doing nothing with what God has given us is not neutrality but actually sinful disobedience?
