

Pastor Roy's Study Questions on Luke 19:28-48 (July 5, 2026)

— *Below are questions to help further our understanding of Sundays Sermon.* —

1. Jesus prepared for His triumphal entry since before time with precise timing. How does understanding God's sovereign preparation for significant moments in history affect the way you trust His timing in your own life?
2. The disciples were asked to take a step of obedience without knowing exactly what it would involve. What step of faith might God be calling you to take today, even if you cannot see the full picture?
3. The crowd honored Jesus by spreading their cloaks on the road, giving up their prized possessions. What are you willing to sacrifice to honor Christ as King in your daily life?
4. Jesus told the Pharisees that if the people were silent, the very stones would cry out. What does this reveal about the inevitability of God receiving glory, and how should that shape our worship?
5. Jesus wept over Jerusalem because the people did not recognize the time of their visitation. In what ways might we be blind to God's work in our own generation, and how can we open our eyes to see Him?
6. Jesus cleansed the temple because it had become a den of robbers rather than a house of prayer. How can we ensure that our churches and our hearts remain focused on true worship rather than worldly pursuits?
7. The sermon warns that false teachers demand money under false pretenses. How can we discern between legitimate ministry needs and manipulation, and what is our responsibility when we encounter such corruption?
8. John Quincy Adams called the Declaration of Independence the ark of the covenant for Americans. How do we balance our love for country with our ultimate allegiance to God's Kingdom?
9. The sermon states that America has removed God from schools, government, and the public square, much like Israel turned away from God. What is our role as believers in bringing reverence for God back into our culture?
10. The call for revival begins in the heart of each believer. What specific areas of your spiritual life need awakening, and how will you commit to going deeper in your faith to impact your community?
