— *Below are questions to help further our understanding of today's sermon.* —

1. How can we examine our own lives to determine whether we are truly bearing fruit for Christ, or merely maintaining an appearance of faith without genuine spiritual reality?
2. In what ways might fear, like the servant who hid his talent, prevent us from using the gifts and abilities God has given us for His kingdom?
3. What does it mean to be faithful with little, and how can we cultivate contentment and diligence regardless of how our gifts compare to others?
4. How does the concept of accountability before God impact the way you approach your daily responsibilities and spiritual calling?
5. What specific talents or abilities has God given you, and are you actively using them to bring Him glory, or have you buried them in the ground?
6. Why do you think Jesus emphasized that to whom much is given, much is required, and how does this principle challenge our understanding of grace and responsibility?
7. How can we distinguish between genuine saving faith that produces fruit and a false profession of faith that lacks spiritual vitality?
8. What practical steps can we take to ensure we are not becoming slothful or complacent in our walk with Christ as we await His return?
9. How does the urgency of Christ's imminent return affect your priorities, relationships, and daily decisions in following Him?
10. In what ways might jealousy or comparison with other believers prevent us from being faithful with what God has specifically entrusted to us?
