Getting to Know You Questions:

1. When you think of your faith in Jesus, would you describe it as “child-like”? What makes sense about that phrase and what is confusing to you about it?

Into the Bible Questions:

Read John 7:37-38

37 On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, “If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. 38 Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, ‘Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.’”

2. Jesus says, “If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink.” What do you think it means to be spiritually thirsty?

3. How is what Jesus offers different from the “fountain of youth” idea described in the message?

Read Matthew 18:3-4

3 and said, “Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. 4 Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.”

4. Why do you think Jesus connects childlikeness with humility and dependence?

5. What are some ways we tend to rely on ourselves instead of God as we get older?

6. What would it practically look like for you to depend on Jesus like a child this week?

Read 1 Peter 1:14-16

14 As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, 15 but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, 16 since it is written, “You shall be holy, for I am holy.”

7. The message talks about obedience leading to growth. Why do you think obedience to God can sometimes feel difficult or undesirable?

8. Can you think of a time when obeying God led to something good in your life (even if it was hard at first)?

9. What is one area of your life right now where God might be calling you to greater obedience?

Application Question:

1. What is one practical step you can take this week to “come to Jesus and drink” (prayer, Scripture, surrender, etc.)?

2. How can this group help each other grow in childlike faith?
