Consider the following daily prompts during your prayer time this month.

TUESDAY—Home—Lift up your family, friends, neighbors, and work associates.

WEDNESDAY—Church—Pray for Polk Street Methodist Church—our staff, leaders, members, missions, and ministries.

THURSDAY—City—Lift up the City of Amarillo and the entire Panhandle area.

FRIDAY—Church Universal—Pray for the Global Methodist Church and the Church universal.
