- The Poor Widow (2 Kings 4:1-7)

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- Matthew 6:31-33 - <sup>31</sup> “Therefore do not worry, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ <sup>32</sup> For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. <sup>33</sup> But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- Miracle Two: Healing
- Both Elijah and Elisha raised young men back to life (1 Kings 17:17-24 & 2 Kings 4:18-37)
- Naaman (2 Kings 5:1-19)

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- Psalm 103:3 - <sup>3</sup> Who forgives all your iniquities,  
Who heals all your diseases
- 3 John 1:2 - <sup>2</sup> Beloved, I pray that you may prosper  
in all things and be in health, just as your soul  
prosper.
- Psalm 41:3 - <sup>3</sup> The Lord nurses them when they are  
sick and restores them to health.

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- Miracle Three: Victory
- Over the Prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18:1-40)
- Elijah Calls Fire Down from Heaven (2 Kings 1:9-13)
- In Face of Overwhelming Odds (2 Kings 6:14-23)

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- 1 John 4:4 - <sup>4</sup> You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.
- Romans 6:22 - <sup>22</sup> But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life.

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- Miracle Four: Sustaining Power
- Elijah Fed by Ravens (1 Kings 17:1-7)
- Elijah Fed by the Angel of the Lord (1 Kings 19:1-18)

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- God met Elijah, not with harsh words, but with understanding.
- God let Elijah rest, sustained him with food and water and at the appropriate time God spoke and reassured Elijah and encouraged him to continue to be faithful.

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- Isaiah 46:3-5 - <sup>3</sup>“Listen to me, you descendants of Jacob, all the remnant of the people of Israel, you whom I have upheld since your birth, and have carried since you were born. <sup>4</sup> Even to your old age and gray hairs I am he, I am he who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you; I will sustain you and I will rescue you. <sup>5</sup> “With whom will you compare me or count me equal? To whom will you liken me that we may be compared? (NIV)

# The Miracles of Elijah and Elisha:

- Psalm 3:5 - <sup>5</sup> I lay down and slept; I awoke, for the Lord sustained me.
- Psalm 55:22 - <sup>22</sup> Cast your burden on the Lord, and He shall sustain you; He shall never permit the righteous to be moved.

# Lessons From the Miracle:

- 1. Each miracle started with an outward step of faith.
- There was more than an internal, “I believe” but an outward action that showed their faith.
- Sometimes, especially when healing is involved; there may not be too much we can seemingly do.

# Lessons From the Miracle:

- 2. Each miracle required surrender and humility.
- Naaman is the best example.

# Lessons From the Miracle:

- 3. Each miracle focused on God and His power & promises and not their circumstances.
- They chose to believe God.

# Lessons From the Miracle:

- 4. Each miracle self was removed to allow God to fight.
- Though they showed up and walked in obedience, they did not rely on their own strength or wisdom.
